REGULÆ GENERALES.

THE following Rules are hereby established, for the despatch of business in the Supreme Court, during the year 1891.

TERMS, HOLIDAYS, SITTINGS, AND VACATIONS.

1. The Terms, Holidays, Vacations, Circuits, and Sittings of the Court shall be those mentioned in the Law Almanac annexed hereto.

ADDITIONAL DAYS FOR DEMURRERS, AND SPECIAL CASES.

2. Demurrers and Special Cases may be heard on such additional days as two Judges shall appoint.

EQUITY, BANKRUPTCY, ECCLESIASTICAL, AND DIVORCE APPEALS.

3. Equity, Bankruptey, Ecclesiastical, and Divorce Appeals may be set down for, and will take precedence, on the Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of the second and of each alternate week during Term. Appeals in interlocutory motions and index weaking the set of th

Causes on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, at 11 o'clock; for the hearing of Motions and Petitions on Monday and Wednesday, from 10 to 11 o'clock ; in Chambers, for Chamber applications, on Tuesday, from 10 to 11 o'clock for Lunacy matters, on Thursday, from 10 to 11 clock; and for Motions, Petitions, adjourned Summonses, Decrees on further directions, Motions for Decree, Demurrers, Special Cases Short Causes and other civily Cases, Short Causes, and other similar matters, on Friday. from 11 o'clock.

5. Applications for Probates and Letters of Administration and other non-contentious Ecclesiastical matters will be taken by the Judge in Bankruptey on Thursday from 10 o'clock. All other Ecclesiastical matters will be taken by the Judge in Bankruptey at such times as he shall appoint. The Judge in Bankruptcy will also take all Company matters on Wednesday at 10 o'clock, and the General Bankruptcy Business as follows :---Motions under Section 130 on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, at 11 o'clock; Motions generally on Tuesday and Friday, at 10 o'clock; Creditors' Petitions and Motions to set aside Bankruptoy Notices, on Thursday, at 11 o'clock; and Applica-tions for Certificates and Release, on Friday, at 11 o'clock.

SETTING DOWN GAUSES AT LAW.

6. To the extent limited for each day as next mentioned. Causes shall be set down consecutively only. No more than four Causes shall be set down for any day for Trial by a Jury of four persons, nor more than two Causes for Trial by a Special Jury, or three Causes by a Common Jury : Provided that an additional number of Causes, not exceeding two, may be set down for any day, if the Prothonotary shall see fit. © State of New South Wales through the Attorney General's Department

7. For each day of the Sittings for Causes there shall be three separate Cause Lists, which will be taken respectively in No. 1, No. 2, and No. 3 Jury Courts. And until all Lists have been filled, in accordance with the preceding Rule, no Cause shall (except by leave of the Prothonotary, approved of in writing by a Judge) be set down in any List for any subsequent day.

JURIES OF TWELVE.

8. Provided that Causes for Trial by Juries of Twelve (whether Special or Common Jurcors) shall be set down for such days only as the Prothonotary shall in each case direct.

CAUSES UNCONCLUDED DURING THE SITTINGS.

9. Any Cause, not concluded on the last day of the Sittings, may be continued on such day or days as the Presiding Judge shall think fit.

TRANSFERRING CAUSES.

10. Causes, on the List of any Court, may be transferred to the List of any other, by order of a Judge, for Trial on the day next but one following, or any later day: Provided that no such day shall be earlier than that for which the Cause was first entered.

REMANETS GENERALLY.

11. Remanets from any Sitting shall have precedence over other Causes; and shall be set down by the Prothonotary, each according to its appropriate List, for the next Sittings.

CAUSES ON CIRCUIT.

12. Causes for Trial in the Circuit Courts, respectively, shall be entered for the day fixed for holding the Circuit in the Law Almanac annexed hereto. But whenever it shall appear to the Chief Justice, or to the Judge intending to hold any Circuit Court, that it will not be convenient to hear the Civil Causes (if any) set down for trial at that Court on the day named for such Causes in the Calendar for the time being, it shall be competent to the Chief Justice or to such Judge, not less than sixteen days before the day which shall have been fixed by the Calendar for opening the said Court, to appoint some other day for the trial of such Causes, by direction to the Prothonotary, and the Prothonotary shall thereupon forthwith give notice of such appointment to the Solicitors in the said Causes or to their town agents, and also to the Sheriff, so that the Civil Jury may be summoned or receive notification accordingly, and all notices already given between the parties shall hold good and be applied to the day so specially appointed, and all notices and subpomas to be thereafter given or issued shall be given or issued for that day.

13. If there shall be no Civil Causes set down and notice of trial given and notified to the Prothonotary for any Circuit Court, up to the sixteenth day before the day named in the Calendar for the time being for the trial of Civil Causes thereat, no jury shall be summoned to such Court for the trial of Civil Issues without the leave of a Judge, and it shall be the duty of the Prothonotary to give notice to the Sheriff accordingly.

CROWN CASES RESERVED.

14. Special Cases reserved on any Criminal Trial, when received by the Prothonotary, shall be set down for hearing on the next ensuing Friday on which the Court shall sit, unless a Judge shall otherwise order.

MOTIONS NISI FOR NEW TRIAL.

15. All Causes in which the usual Memorandum has been filed of a Motion Nisi for a New Trial, shall be entered in the order of filing; and (subject to the provisions of the Rules of the 21st May, 1888) shall be called on in that order on every day in Term until disposed of.

PARTIES NOT READY TO PROCEED.

16. Every case so called on, in which no Counsel shall moveshall (unless the Court extends the time) be struck out of the Paper—with leave to the adverse Party to sign Judgment. And the like, where a Rule Nisi has been granted, and the Moving Party is not prepared to proceed.

FILED MEMORANDUM NECESSARY.

17. A filed Memorandum shall in all cases be necessary, under the Rules of the 19th August, 1861, and shall be filed in triplicate; but, where the Cause shall have ended during the Term, or within four days preceding the Term, no Motion in pursuance of such Memorandum need be made earlier than the fourth day after the filing thereof.

BULES NISI FOR NEW TRIAL,

 Every Rule Nisi for a New Trial shall be entered in the Term Book as scon as granted, and called on in the order in which it was granted; and the Moving Party shall in all cases begin, and the Party showing cause follow—one Counsel having the reply.
 19. Every such Rule shall be taken out, filed in triplicate, and

19. Every such Rule shall be taken out, filed in triplicate, and served within seven days after it has been granted, otherwise it shall be held to have lapsed, and the Prothonotary shall thereupon strike the case out of the Term Book.

MOTIONS ON NOTICE.

20. All Motions on notice shall be entered in the Term Paper by the Prothonotary in the order in which they are filed, and shall come on for hearing in the said order.

PRECEDENCE OF BUSINESS.

21. Subject to Rule 3, Motions Nisi for New Trials will, on every day except *Friday*, have precedence of all other business. On *Fridays* Criminal and other Crown Cases will have precedence. Cn *Tuesdays* and on *Fridays* (after Criminal business) Motions generally will have precedence, then appeals in cases of emergency in interlocutory motions in the Equity, Bankruptey, Ecclesiastical, and Divorce jurisdictions; then Motions on Notice, and then Motions. On *Thursdays* Demurrers, Special Cases, and District Court Appeals will have precedence. By leave of the Court, Common Motions may be taken on any day.

ORDER OF BUSINESS GENERALLY.

22. On every day, subject to the preceding Rule, all Matters in the Term Paper for argument shall be entered, and called on and heard, in the order of their date. Rules Nisi for New Trials will be classed under this Rule. All other Rules to show cause (unless the Court shall otherwise order) will be entered for and heard on some Tuesday or Friday only.

VACATION BUSINESS.

23. During the Vacations, Causes may be set down, and notices of Trial, and to admit or produce documents, may be given, and all Writs may be issued, executed, and returned; and in every case Costs may be taxed if the Taxing Officers shall deem it necessary ; and all necessary proceedings may be taken for the purposes of an Appeal, or for obtaining or dissolving any injunction. And Summonese in cases of emergency may be returnable in Chambers on any Friday.

24. During the Vacations no other business than that above specified will be taken without the leave of a Judge, nor shall any pleadings be filed or delivered without such leave, nor shall Time run at Law or in Equity.

25. In actions upon Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, and Cheques, all steps and proceedings which may be taken out of vacation without the leave of a Judge, may be taken during vacation without such leave, and Time shall run at Law, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the preceding Rule contained.

CHAMBER BUSINESS.

26. Chamber Business at Law will be taken on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, at 10 o'clock, except during the sittings for the trial of Causes and during Term, when the Chamber business will be taken at 9'30 a.m.: Provided that a Summons may be returnable on any other day by order of a Judge.

27. Every Summons returnable on a Monday shall be served on the party whose attendance is required before 1 o'clock of the proceeding Friday afternoon, unless a Judge shall otherwise order.

28. No Chamber application will be entertained on any day, in or out of Term (except in cases of emergency) after 1 o'clock.

SATURDAYS.

29. There will be no Sitting of the Court in Sydney (except for the trial of Prisoners and except the last day of Term) on any Saturday: Provided that any Argument or Trial, not concluded on Friday, may be continued on Saturday, if the Court or Presiding Judge shall think fit. On all Saturdays the Supreme Court Offices will close at 12 o'clock noon.

Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, only daughter of His late Royal Highness Edward, Duke of Kent : born May 24. 1819 : succeeded to the throne on the decease of her uncle King William IV, June 20, 1837 ; proclaimed June 21 ; crowned June 28, 1838; married February 10, 1840, at the Chapel Royal, St. James's, to her cousin, Field Marshal His Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emanuel, Duke of Saxe, Prince of Saxe Coburg and Gotha (born August 26, 1819), K.T., G.C.B., &c.; died Dec. 14, 1861. Issue-Victoria Adelaide Mary Louisa, Princess Royal, born Nov. 21, 1840; married Jan. 25, 1858, to His Imperial Highness Frederick III, late Emperor of Germany. Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, born 9 Nov., 1841; married March 10, 1863, to Princess Alexandra of Denmark. Alice Maud Mary, born April 25, 1843, married July 1, 1862, to Prince Frederick William Louis, of Hesse; died Dec. 14, 1878. Alfred Ernest Albert, born Aug. 6, 1844 ; married January 23, 1874, to Grand Duchess Marie Alexandrovna of Russia. Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married July 5, 1866, to Prince Christian of Augustenberg. Louisa Carolina Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married March 21, 1871, to the Marquis of Lorne. Arthur Patrick William Albert, born May 1, 1850; married March 13, 1879, to Princess Louise of Prussia. Leopold George Duncan Albert, born April 7, 1853; married April 27, 1882, to Princess Helen of Waldeck-Pyrmont; died March 28, 1884. Beatrice Mary Victoria Feodore, born April 14, 1857; married July 23, 1885, to Prince Henry of Battenberg.

And all such fees shall be paid to the Secretary and certified by him to the Board as so paid before the candidate shall be admitted to any examination.

23. The Board may appoint the Chief Clerk of the Secretary. Supreme Court, or such other person as may be approved, to act as Secretary to the Board, and such Secretary shall attend all meetings of the Board, keep minutes of all its proceedings, conduct its correspondence, and perform such other duties as the Board may require.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT RELATING TO THE ADMISSION OF ATTORNEYS.

(N.B.-The additional and amending Rules referred to are printed at the end of these Rules.)

REGULÆ GENERALES.

Tuesday, the 18th day of December, A.D. 1877.

1. So soon as these Rules shall come into operation all former Rules relating to the admission of persons to appear and act as Attorneys, Solicitors, and Proctors of the Supreme Court of New South Wales shall be repealed.

2. The designation "Solicitor" shall, in these Rules, and in all future proceedings and notices or otherwise, be deemed to comprise Attorneys and Proctors as well as Solicitors.

Admission of Solicitors.

3. The following persons only shall be eligible to be admitted as Solicitors of the Court :-- (a)

- 1st. Persons actually admitted as Attorneys or Solicitors of the Courts of England or Ireland, and Writers to the Signet of Scotland, and having actually resided in
- this Colony for the preceding three months. 2nd. The Attorneys, Solicitors, and Proctors (having actually resided in this Colony for the preceding three months) of any of the other Australasian Colonies of Great Britain wherein a standard of qualification substantially equal to that of this Colony shall, in the opinion of the Judges of this Court, have been adopted and acted upon, and wherein corresponding eligibility for the admission of the practitioners of this Court to the Courts of such Colonies shall have been established.

3rd. Persons having been articled to some practising Solicitor in New South Wales, and having served the term of five years' clerkship, or if a Bachelor of Arts

or Master of Arts as hereinafter mentioned previous to entoring into articles, the torm of three years' clerkship, and having passed the examinations required by these Rules: Provided that such persons may serve for any part of such term not exceeding one year with the Sydney Agent of such Solicitor without assignment, and such service with such Sydney Agent shall be equivalent to service for the same time with such Solicitor under the original articles: Provided also that such Sydney Agent shall be required to answer such questions and give such certificates as he would have been required to answer and give if such person had actually served him under articles of assignment.(a)

- 4th. Persons who having been articled to an Attorney or Solicitor of one of the Queen's Superior Courts of Great Britain or Ireland, or to a Writer to the Signet in Scotland, shall have served the full term of years required under such articles, and shall have passed the Intermediate Examinations in England, Ireland, or Scotland, as the case may be ; or who, having been so articled, and having served for any period of time shall complete the residue of the full term of years as Clerk to a Solicitor of this Court ; or who, having been duly articled and served as aforesaid in New South Wales, shall complete the residue of such term with any solicitor of the Superior Courts in England or Ireland, or with a Writer to the Signet in Scotland ; and who in the two last-mentioned cases shall have passed the requisite Intermediate Examinations either in this Colony or in England, Ireland, or Scotland : Provided that in all cases within this clause, the final examinations required by these Rules shall be passed before the Board of Examiners to be appointed hereunder.(b)
- 5th. Persons who at the time of the passing of these Rules have completed, or who have commenced and shall complete the term of five years of clerkship in the Office of the Supreme Court or the Office of the Crown Solicitor, and shall pass the Final Examination required by these Rules, for the purposes of which examinations such persons shall be deemed to be articled Clerks within the Rules hereinatter contained relating thereto.

Articled Clerks.

4. No Solicitor of the Court shall be allowed to have more than three articled Clerks at one time; and before any person shall be articled with a view to his admission as a Solicitor of this Court, he shall be introduced to the Judges by his intended master, who shall produce satisfactory certificates of the character and fitness of such person to be admitted to Articles with such view; and such person shall not be less than soventeen years of age, and shall be approved of by the Judges before entring into Articles.

5. Every person desirous of entering into Articles of Clerkship, who shall not have taken the Degree of Bachelor of . Arts or Master of Arts in the University of Sydney, or other University, as provided by the Act of the Lezislature passed in the 22nd year of Her Majesty, number 23, shall, before approval of such Articles, produce to the Prothonotary a Certificate of his having passed a Matriculation Examination (b) in the said University, or in some other University recognised by it; or a Certificate from the Registrar of the University of Sydney, of his having passed some equivalent Examination before Protosors or Examiners appointed by the Sonate thereof; or a Certificate of his having passed, in England, Scotland, or Ireland, the Preliminary Examination which articled Clerks may be there required to pass, and shall lodge with the said Prothonotary a copy of such Certificate, (a)

6. Every future Articled Clork shall, after he shall have entered into Articles, and during his term of Clerkship, pass two Intermediate Examinations, with an interval of at least one year between each, in the subjects of History and Law respectively—such Examination in History to be by such Professor or Examiner as the Senate of the University of Sydney, or this Court may appoint in that behalf; and such Examination in Law to be by the Board of Examiners appointed under these Rules, and to have relation to the Laws of Keal and Personal Property as set forth in the following works, that is to say, "Williams on Real Property," and "Williams on Personal Property": Provided that in the case of Masters of Arts of Bachelors of Arts, as hereinbefore mentioned, no intermediate Examination otherwise than in Law shall be required.

7. No person who was articled previous to the passing of these Rules, nor any person who at the time of the passing thereof shall have completed, or shall have commenced and shall hereafter complete the term of five years of clerkship in the Office of the Supreme Court or of the Crown Solicitor, shall be required to pass any other but the Final Examination required by these Rules. But any such person may, if he shall think fit, submit to either or both of the intermediate examinations mentioned in the last preceding Rule.

S. No person during the time he shall be articled to a Solicitor with a view to his admission, shall pursue any profession, trade, or business, other than the proper business of a Solicitor.

Examiners and Examinations.

9. All Examinations in Law, both Intermediate and Final, shall be by a Board consisting of two Barristers and four Solicitors to be annually appointed by the Court, of which Board any three shall be a quorum ; and all members of such Board shall continue in office until their successors shall have been appointed.

. 10. No future Articled Clerk shall be admitted to the Final Examinations until an interval of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed after he shall have passed the Second Intermediate Examination required by these Rules.

11. If any Articled Clerk shall fail to pass at an Examination required of him, whether intermediate or Final, he may from time to time apply for and shall be allowed a Re-examination after three calendar months from any such failure.

12. No Articled Clerk shall be admitted to practise unless he shall produce Certificates of his having passed to the satisfaction of the Examiners in all the Examinations required of him by these Rules.

13. The Board shall appoint one day at least in every Term for holding an Intermediate Examination in Law.

14. Final Examinations shall be held at the Supreme Court House, on such days, being within the last ten days of every Term, as the Board of Examiners shall appoint.

15. Every person applying for Examination shall attend the said Board of Examiners at the Supreme Court House, at such time or times as shall be appointed for that purpose by the said Board.

16. Persons applying for Final Examination in law shall submit to be examined by the said Board, and must pass, in four at least of the following branches of the Law :---

- 1. Real Property and Conveyancing,
- 2. Common Law.
- 3. Equity, Divorce and Matrimonial, and Ecclesiastical Law.
- 4. Criminal Law.
- 5. Practice of the Supreme Court in Insolvency.
- 6. Jurisdiction and practice of the Inferior Courts,

17. The Board of Examiners shall from time to time, with the approval of the Judges, notify the Books and portions of books in which they intend, after not less than six months thereafter, to conduct the Final Examinations in Law.

18. If the Examiner conducting the Examination of an Articled Clerk in History, under these Rules, shall be satisfied with the answers given by him, he shall certify the same under his hand in the following terms, viz. —

To the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court :

I being the Examiner appointed to conduct the Examination in History of A.B. as a Solicitor's Articled Clerk, do hereby certify that I have examined the said A.B. in History, and that he has passed a satisfactory Examination therein.

19. The Chief Clerk of the Supreme Court, or such other person as the Judges may from time to time appoint, shall be and act as Secretary to the Board of Examiners, and shall attend all meetings of the Board and keep minutes of all its proceedings and conduct its correspondence, and perform such other duties as the Board may require.

22. Every Articled Clerk shall, before being admitted to either of the Intermediate Examinations hereby required, pay into the hands of the Prothonotary an Examination Fee of *Five* pounds, and shall also, before admission to his Final Examination in Law, pay a fee of *Ten* pounds. (a) And such respective fees shall be by such Prothonotary paid rateably to the Examinations shall be conducted. (b)

Notices, & c.

23. Every Articled Clerk desirous of being examined at an Intermediate Examination shall give notice in writing of such his desire to the Prothonotary, before the commencement of the Term during which he desires to be examined.

24. Every person not previously admitted as a Solicitor, and desirous of being admitted under any of the last three clauses of Kule 3, shall, in addition to the notices hereafter required, give at the least one month's notice to the Board of Examiners of his intention to apply for Final Examination, by leaving the notice with the Prothonotary, which notice shall also state his place or places of residence, and service for the last two years; and before any such person shall be

25. Any person previously admitted as aforesaid, and desirous of being admitted under either of the first two clauses of Rule 3, shall at the time of giving the notice hereafter required, file with the Prothonotary the Affidavit on which he seeks for admission, together with the Certificate of his previous admission, which Affidavit shall contain the following allegations, viz. :- Deponent's admission in one of the aforesaid Courts (a); that he has not done or committed any act or thing which would cause his name to be struck off the Roll of the said Court ; and that to the best of his knowledge and belief his name still remains on the said Roll; that the copy of the Certificate annexed to his said affidavit is a true copy of his admission, and that he is the person named therein; the time when he ceased to practise; the time of his arrival in the Colony; that he has actually resided in this Colony for the preceding three months, the mode of his employment from the time he ceased to practise, and a reference to one or more respectable householder or householders resident within the Colony, to whom he is known; and the Rule (b) for the admission of such last-mentioned person shall be drawn up on reading such Affidavit, which Rule shall be conditional for twelve months, unless the Judges shall see cause to the contrary.

26. Every person who shall intend to apply for admission as a Solicitor of this Court (whether previously admitted elsewhere or not) shall, before the commencement of the Term in which he shall so apply, cause his name and place of abode, written in legible character, to be affixed in the Office of the Supreme Court, and also in the vestibule of the Courthouse; and shall also cause notice of his intended application to be three several times published in two public newspapers of Sydney, during such Term, and no admission shall take place except only on the last day of such Term.

27. Every person applying at the expiration of his Articles to be admitted a Solicitor of the Court shall, before the commencement of the Term in which he is desirous of being admitted, leave or cause to be left with the Prothonotary his Articles of Clerksbip (c), and also any assignment which may have been made thereof, and the Certificates of his having passed the required Examinations, together with answers to the several questions in the Appendix hercunto annexed, signed by the applicant, and also by the Solicitor or Solicitors with whom he shall have served his clerkship, and by two respectable householdcars to whom he is personally known.

28. In case the applicant shall show sufficient cause to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners why the preceding regulation cannot be fully complied with, it shall be in the power of the said Board, upon sufficient proof being given of the same, to dispense with any part of the said regulation that they may think fit or reasonable.

29. Every person applying for admission shall also, if required, sign and leave, or cause to be left, with the Prothonotary, answers in writing to such other written or printed questions as shall be proposed by the Board of Examiners touching his service and conduct; and shall also, if required, attend the said Board personally for the purpose of giving further explanations touching the same; and shall also, if required, procure the attendance of the Solicitor or Solicitors with whom he shall have served his elerkship as aforesaid; and also, if required, procure the attendance of such other person or persons as the Board may direct, to answer either personally or in writing any questions touching such service or conduct, or shall make proof to the satisfaction of the said Board of his inability to procure the same.

Miscellaneous.

30. Every Solicitor having been admitted on the Roll of this Court and cessing to practise for twelve months continuously may be struck off the Roll, and shall not be readmitted without a Term's notice of his intention to apply for such readmission; and at the time of giving such notice shall cause to be filed the Affidavit on which he seeks to be readmitted, with the Prothonotary, which Affidavit shall contain, in addition to the particulars now required, a statement of his place or places of abode, during the last preceding year, and how he has employed his time since he ceased to practise; and the rule for readmission of such person shall be drawn up on reading such Affidavit.

31. No Solicitor of the Court shall employ as a clerk, assistant, or writer, in or about his business as a Solicitor, any person who hath been or who shall be convicted of any felony or of wilful and corrupt perjury, or subornation of perjury, or common bartatry.

32. Nothing in these Rules contained shall in any way interfere with, alter, or prejudice the authority of the Court to suspend or remove from the Rolls of Solicitors any person who shall, in the opinion of the Court, have been guilty of misconduct or of malpractice justifying such suspension or removal.

Commencement of Rules.

33. These Rules shall come into force on the first day of January, A.D. 1878, save only so far as they relate to the Matriculation Examinations or their equivalent as required by these Rules; the provisions in respect of which shall not come into operation until after the next Matriculation and Public Examinations of the University of Sydney.

Axy person who shall be or shall have been conditionally admitted a Solicitor for twelve months in pursuance of the twenty-fifth rule of the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, shall, three months previous to the expiration of such twelve months, serve written notices on the Prothonotary and on the Secretary of the Incorporated Law Institute of his intention to apply to the Court to have such conditional admittance confirmed, and at the time of serving such notice on the Prothonotary, he shall file an affidavit in which he shall depose that he has not been engaged or occupied at any time since his conditional admission in any profession, business, pursuit, or calling, other than that of a Solicitor, and that he has not committed or omitted. or been privy to or cognizant of any act, matter, or thing disentitling him to such confirmation. And in case such conditional admission be not confirmed, and the rule drawn up accordingly at the expiration of such twelve months, the said conditional admission shall cease to operate after that time. unless the Judges shall in any case see cause to the contrary.

The third sub-clause of Rule three of the Rules relating to the admission of Attorneys, made on the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following sub-clause is hereby made and shall be read as sub-clause three :--

"3rd. Persons having been articled to a practising Solicitor in New South Wales, and having served the term of five years' clerkship, or if they have taken a degree in a University as hereinafter mentioned previously to entering into articles, the term of three years' clerkship, and having passed the examinations required by these Rules : Provided that such persons may serve for any part of such term not exceeding one year with the Sydney agent of such Solicitor without assignment, and such service with such Sydney agent shall be equivalent to service for the same time with such Solicitor under the original articles : Provided that Sydney agent shall be required to answer such questions and give such certificates as he would have been required to answer and give fi such person had actually served him under articles of assignment."

And Rule five of the said Rules is also hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Rule is hereby made and shall be read as Rule five :--

"5. Every person desirous of entering into articles of clerkship who shall not have taken a degree in the University of Sydney, or in some other University recognized by it, shall, before approval of such articles, produce to the Prothonotary a certificate of his having passed a Matriculation Examination in the said University, or in some other University recognized by it, or a certificate from the Registrar of the University of Sydney of his having passed some equivalent Examination before Professors or Examiners appointed by the Senate thereof, or a certificate of his having passed in England, Scotland, or Ireland the preliminary Examination which articled clerks may be there required to pass, and shall lodge with the said Prothonotary a copy of such certificate."

 - b. Persons who, having been articled to a Solicitor of one of the Queen's Superior Courts of Great Britain or Ireland, or to a Writer to the Signet in Scotland, or to a Solicitor of this Court, shall serve under assignment or re-assignment any portion or portions of their articles either in England, Ireland, or Scotland, or in this Colony, and shall complete the residue of their articles either in England, Ireland, or Scotland, or in this Colony;

Provided that in the cases under section b of this sub-clause the requisite Intermediate Examinations may be passed either in this Colony or in England, Ireland, or Scotland, and that the time occupied in travelling between this Colony and Great Britain, Ireland, or Scotland, shall be made up hy service under articles which may be extended for the requisite period. And provided also that in all cases within this sub-clause the Final Examinations required by these Rules shall be passed before the Board of Examiners appointed hereunder. And this subclause shall take effect as from the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eizht hundred and seventy-seven.
