REGULÆ GENERALES.

The following Rules are hereby established, for the despatch of business in the Supreme Court, during the year 1893 :—

TERMS, HOLIDAYS, SITTINGS, AND VACATIONS.

1. The Terms, Holidays, Vacations, Circuits, and Sittings of the Court shall be those mentioned in the Law Almanac annexed hereto.

ADDITIONAL DAYS FOR DEMURRERS, AND SPECIAL CASES.

2. Demurrers and Special Cases may be heard on such additional days as two Judges shall appoint.

EQUITY, BANKRUPTCY, PROBATE, AND DIVORCE APPEALS.

3 Equity, Bankruptcy, Probate, and Divorce Appeals may be set down for, and will take precedence, on the Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of the second and of each alternate week during Term. Appeals in interlocutory motions in these jurisdictions may, in case of emergency, be heard on any Tuesday or Friday in Term.

EQUITY.

4. The Chief Judge in Equity will sit for the hearing of Causes on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, at 11 o'clock; for the hearing of Motions and Petitions on Monday and Wednesday, from 10 to 11 o'clock; in Chambers, for Chamber applications, on Tuesday, from 10 to 11 o'clock; for Lunacy matters, on Thursday, from 10 to 11 o'clock; and for Motions, Petitions, adjourned Summonses, Decrees on further directions, Motions for Decree, Demurrers, Special Cases, Short Causes, and other similar matters, on Friday, from 11 o'clock.

PROBATE, BANKRUPTCY, AND COMPANY MATTERS.

5. Applications for Probates and Letters of Administration and other non-contentious Probate matters will be taken by the Probate Judge on Thursday at 10 o'clock. All other Probate matters will be taken by the Probate Judge at such times as he shall appoint.

The Judge in Bankruptcy will take all Company matters on Tuesday at 10 o'clock, and the General Bankruptcy Business as follows:—Motions under Section 130 on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, at 11 o'clock; Motions generally on Wednesday and Friday, at 10 o'clock; Creditors' Petitions and Motions to set aside Bankruptcy Notices, on Thursday, at 11 o'clock; and Applications for Certificates and Release, on Friday, at 11 o'clock.

SETTING DOWN CAUSES AT LAW.

6. To the extent limited for each day as next mentioned, Causes shall be set down consecutively only. No more than four Causes shall be set down for any day for Trial by a Jury of four persons, nor more than two Causes for Trial by a Special

Jury, or three Causes by a Common Jury : Provided that an additional number of Causes, not exceeding two, may be set down for any day, if the Prothonotary shall see fit.

7. For each day of the Sittings for Causes there shall be three separate Cause Lists, which will be taken respectively in No. 1, No. 2, and No. 3 Jury Courts. And until all Lists have been filled, in accordance with the preceding Rule, no Cause shall (except by leave of the Prothonotary, approved of in writing by a Judge) be set down in any List for any subsequent day.

JURIES OF TWELVE.

8. Provided that Causes for Trial by Juries of Twelve (whether Special or Common Jurors) shall be set down for such days only as the Prothonotary shall in each case direct.

CAUSES UNCONCLUDED DURING THE SITTINGS.

9. Any Cause, not concluded on the last day of the Sittings, may be continued on such day or days as the Presiding Judge shall think fit.

TRANSFERRING CAUSES.

10. Causes, on the List of any Court, may be transferred to the List of any other, by order of a Judge, for Trial on the day next but one following, or any later day : Provided that no such day shall be earlier than that for which the Cause was first entered.

REMANETS GENERALLY.

11. Remanets from any Sitting shall have precedence over other Causes ; and shall be set down by the Prothonotary, each according to its appropriate List, for the next Sittings.

CAUSES ON CIRCUIT.

12. Causes for Trial in the Circuit Courts, respectively, shall be entered for the day fixed for holding the Circuit in the Law Almanac annexed hereto. But whenever it shall appear to the Chief Justice, or to the Judge intending to hold any Circuit Court, that it will not be convenient to hear the Civil Causes (if any) set down for trial at that Court on the day named for such Causes in the Calendar for the time being, it shall be competent to the Chief Justice or to such Judge, not less than sixteen days before the day which shall have been fixed by the Calendar for opening the said Court, to appoint some other day for the trial of such Causes, by direction to the Prothonotary, and the Prothonotary shall thereupon forthwith give notice of such appointment to the Solicitors in the said Causes or to their town agents, and also to the Sheriff, so that the Civil Jury may be summoned or receive notification accordingly, and all notices already given between the parties shall hold good and be applied to the day so specially appointed, and all notices and subpoenas to be thereafter given or issued shall be given or issued for that day.

13. If there shall be no Civil Causes set down and notice of trial given and notified to the Prothonotary for any Circuit Court, up to the sixteenth day before the day named in the Calendar for the time being for the trial of Civil Causes thereat, no jury shall be summoned to such Court for the trial of Civil Issues without the leave of a Judge, and it shall be the duty of the Prothonotary to give notice to the Sheriff accordingly.

CROWN CASES RESERVED.

14. *Special Cases reserved on any Criminal Trial*, when received by the Prothonotary, shall be set down for hearing on the next ensuing Friday on which the Court shall sit, unless a Judge shall otherwise order.

MOTIONS NISI FOR NEW TRIAL.

15. All Causes in which the usual Memorandum has been filed of a Motion Nisi for a New Trial, shall be entered in the order of filing; and (subject to the provisions of the Rules of the 21st May, 1888) shall be called on in that order on every day in Term until disposed of.

PARTIES NOT READY TO PROCEED.

16. Every case so called on, in which no Counsel shall move, shall (unless the Court extends the time) be struck out of the Paper—with leave to the adverse Party to sign Judgment. And the like, where a Rule Nisi has been granted, and the Moving Party is not prepared to proceed.

FILED MEMORANDUM NECESSARY.

17. A filed Memorandum shall in all cases be necessary under the Rules of the 19th August, 1861, and shall be filed in triplicate; but, where the Cause shall have ended during the Term, or within four days preceding the Term, no Motion in pursuance of such Memorandum need be made earlier than the fourth day after the filing thereof.

RULES NISI FOR NEW TRIAL.

18. Every Rule Nisi for a New Trial shall be entered in the Term Book as soon as granted, and called on in the order in which it was granted; and the Moving Party shall in all cases begin, and the Party showing cause follow—one Counsel having the reply.

19. Every such Rule shall be taken out, filed in triplicate, and served within seven days after it has been granted, otherwise it shall be held to have lapsed, and the Prothonotary shall thereupon strike the case out of the Term Book.

MOTIONS ON NOTICE.

20. All Motions on notice shall be entered in the Term Paper by the Prothonotary in the order in which they are filed, and shall come on for hearing in the said order.

PRECEDENCE OF BUSINESS.

21. Subject to Rule 3, Motions Nisi for New Trials will, on every day except *Friday*, have precedence of all other business. On *Fridays* Criminal and other Crown Cases will have precedence. On *Tuesdays* and on *Fridays* (after Criminal business) Motions generally will have precedence, then appeals in cases of emergency in interlocutory motions in the Equity, Bankruptcy, Ecclesiastical, and Divorce jurisdictions; then Motions on Notice, and then Motions. On *Thursdays* Demurrers, Special Cases, and District Court Appeals will have precedence. By leave of the Court, Common Motions may be taken on any day.

ORDER OF BUSINESS GENERALLY.

22. On every day, subject to the preceding Rule, all Matters in the Term Paper for argument shall be entered, and called on and heard, in the order of their date. Rules Nisi for New Trials will be classed under this Rule. All other Rules to show cause (unless the Court shall otherwise order) will be entered for and heard on some Tuesday or Friday only.

VACATION BUSINESS.

23. During the Vacations, Causes may be set down, and notices of Trial, and to admit or produce documents, may be given, and all Writs may be issued, executed, and returned; Judgment may be signed in all cases when the time which must expire before same can be signed has expired before vacation begins; and in every case Costs may be taxed if the Taxing Officers shall deem it necessary; and all necessary proceedings may be taken for the purposes of an Appeal, or for obtaining or dissolving any Injunction. And Summonses in cases of emergency may be returnable in Chambers on any Friday.

24. During the Vacations no other business than that above specified will be taken without the leave of a Judge, nor shall any pleadings be filed or delivered without such leave, nor shall Time run at Law or in Equity, provided that the memorandum required to be filed, in pursuance of rule 4 of the 19th August, 1861, must be filed within the times respectively limited by such rule, notwithstanding vacation.

25. In actions upon Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, and Cheques, all steps and proceedings which may be taken out of vacation without the leave of a Judge, may be taken during vacation without such leave, and Time shall run at Law, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the preceding Rule contained.

CHAMBER BUSINESS.

26. Chamber Business at Law will be taken on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, at 10 o'clock, except during the sittings for the trial of Causes and during Term, when the Chamber business will be taken at 9.30 a.m.: Provided that a Summons may be returnable on any other day by order of a Judge.

27. Every Summons returnable on a Monday shall be served on the party whose attendance is required before 1 o'clock of the preceding Friday afternoon, unless a Judge shall otherwise order.

28. No Chamber application will be entertained on any day, in or out of Term (except in cases of emergency) after 1 o'clock.

SATURDAYS.

29. There will be no Sitting of the Court in Sydney (except for the trial of Prisoners and except the last day of Term) on any Saturday: Provided that any Argument or Trial, not concluded on Friday, may be continued on Saturday, if the Court or Presiding Judge shall think fit. On all Saturdays the Supreme Court Offices will close at 12 o'clock noon.

SITTINGS OF THE SUPREME COURT OF NEW SOUTH WALES.

In the Supreme Court of New South Wales, }
Divorce Jurisdiction.

Sydney, the 2nd day of December, A.D. 1892.

I, the Honorable Sir WILLIAM CHARLES WINDEYER, Knight, being the Judge duly appointed under the Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Act of 1873, do hereby, in pursuance of the several powers vested in me by the said Act, appoint that,—

The 27th and 28th days of February,
The 1st, 2nd, 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th days of March,
The 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 22nd, 23rd, and 25th days of May,
The 31st day of July,
The 2nd, 3rd, 14th, 15th, 16th, and 17th days of August,

RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS.

(Under 11 Victoria No. 57 and 39 Victoria No. 32.)

New South Wales to wit.

Thursday, the 24th day of September, A.D. 1891.

WE, the Honorable Sir Frederick Darley, Knight, Chief Justice, and the Honorable Sir William Charles Windeyer, Knight, the Honorable Sir Joseph George Long Innes, Knight, the Honorable Matthew Henry Stephen, the Honorable William Owen, the Honorable William John Foster, and the Honorable Charles James Manning, being the present Judges of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, with the Honorable George Bowen Simpson, Queen's Counsel, the Attorney-General for the time being of the said Colony, and the Honorable Charles Edward Pilcher, Queen's Counsel, and George Houstoun Reid, Esquire, the two barristers elected in the month of December last, according to the Act 11 Victoria No. 57, being the Board constituted under the said Act for the approval of properly qualified persons to be barristers of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, do, by virtue of the provisions of the said Act and of the Act 39 Victoria No. 32, hereby repeal all Rules now subsisting under the said Acts or either of them, except in respect of matters done or commenced to be done thereunder; and we do, in pursuance of the said Acts, make and promulgate the following Rules for the examination and admission of candidates who shall hereafter apply to be admitted barristers of the said Supreme Court under the said Acts: Provided always, that the provisions contained in these Rules shall be deemed to apply to all persons admitted as Students-at-law under the Rules hereby repealed; and provided that the examiners appointed under the rules hereby repealed shall continue to examine under these rules until the end of the present year.

Board

Qualifica-
tions of
barristers.

1. The Board shall meet in the Chambers of the Chief Justice on the first and third Wednesdays in each Term, or on such other dates as the Attorney-General may appoint.

2. Every person, not being a barrister-at-law or advocate admitted in Great Britain or Ireland, applying for admission to the Bar, shall, before being entitled to the certificate referred to in Rule 22—

1. Have been a Student-at-law for the period required and passed all examinations prescribed by these Rules; or
2. Being a graduate of the University of Sydney, admitted under sub-clause 2 of Rule 4 a student-at-law at the end of his second year, produce certificates that he has kept four Terms in one of the Inns of Court in London, and has passed all the examinations required by these Rules; or
3. Have been a Solicitor of this Court, in practice for not less than five years; have caused his name to be struck off the Roll of Solicitors before his admission as student-at-law; and have passed all examinations required by these Rules.

3. Every person applying for admission to the preliminary literary examination under Appendix A, or for admission as a student-at-law, shall give written notice to the Board, through the Attorney-General, fourteen days before the first day of any Term. Such notice shall be accompanied by certificates from two or more persons resident in the Colony, testifying that they have been well acquainted with the applicant and that he is a person of good fame and character. And the Board may require the applicant to give such further proofs as to his fame and character as it may deem necessary.

4. Every applicant for admission as student-at-law shall—

1. Be a graduate in Arts of the University of Sydney or a graduate in Arts, Law, or Medicine of some University within the meaning of the Act 22 Victoria No. 23; or
2. Have passed two annual examinations in the Arts course at the University of Sydney, and shall thereafter in due course become a graduate in Arts of such University; or
3. Have passed two annual examinations in the Arts course at the University of Sydney and the History Examination under Appendix A; or
4. Have passed the preliminary literary examination under Appendix A; or
5. Have been a Solicitor of this Court in practice for not less than five years; have caused his name to be struck off the Roll of Solicitors; and, if not exempt therefrom, have passed the examinations under Appendices A and B.

5. Every student-at-law applying for admission to the Bar, being a graduate at the time he became a student-at-law, or becoming a graduate during his studentship, as provided for by sub-clause 2 of Rule 4, shall have been a student-at-law for at least two years; and every such applicant not being or becoming a graduate as aforesaid, shall have been a student-at-law for at least three years: Provided, however, that a Solicitor admitted a student-at-law under sub-clause 5 of Rule 4, shall not be required to be a student-at-law for a longer period than will elapse between his admission as student-at-law and his passing the final examination in law under Appendix C: Provided also that any person who shall produce a certificate that he has kept four terms as a student-at-law of any English or Irish Inn of Court, may be allowed to count the same as equivalent to one year passed as a student-at-law under these rules.

6. During studentship every student-at-law shall be a *bona fide* resident in this Colony, and before admission to the Bar shall make a declaration in the form in Appendix D, and submit to the Board proof, similar to that required by Rule 3, of his good fame and character: Provided, however, that the residence of a student-at-law in London when keeping his terms at an Inn of Court, under sub-clause 2 of Rule 2, shall not be held to be a contravention of this Rule.

Notice to proceed to examination.

7. Every applicant for examination in Appendices B and C shall, before the commencement of any Term, lodge with the Secretary an application in writing to the Board for admission to such examination, and the Secretary shall send each applicant two clear days' notice of his admission to any examination under these Rules.

Examinations.

8. All examinations shall be held on the second Wednesday in each Term, at such place in Sydney, and at such hour, as may be appointed by the examiners: Provided that the examiners may appoint a later date, so long as such date shall not be more than fourteen days from that mentioned in this Rule; but this limitation shall not take effect in the case of a student-at-law who is proceeding to the examination of Bachelor of Laws in the University of Sydney.

Failure to proceed to examination.

9. If, for a reason to be allowed by the Board, a candidate shall not in due course have proceeded to any examination to which he shall have been admitted, he may, upon application, be readmitted to examination during the next ensuing Term: Provided that the fees under Rule 23 shall be payable on such readmission, unless the Board shall otherwise direct.

Literary examination.

10. Every candidate for the preliminary literary examination shall pass in all the subjects prescribed in Appendix A; and the standard of proficiency required shall be equal to that of the second annual examination in the University of Sydney, so far as such standard is capable of being applied to the subjects of examination under Appendix A.

Roman law examination.

11. Every student-at-law, unless he shall satisfy the Board that he holds the degree of Bachelor of Laws of the University of Sydney, or of some University within the meaning of the Act 22 Victoria No. 23, or the degree of Bachelor of Civil Laws of the University of Oxford, or that he has passed in the First Class of the school of Jurisprudence in the University of Oxford or Cambridge, or that he has passed an examination in Roman, International, and Constitutional Law at one of the Inns of Court in England or Ireland, shall pass an examination in all the subjects prescribed in Appendix B; and until this examination be passed he shall not be admitted to the examination prescribed in Appendix C; but this last proviso shall not apply in the case of a student-at-law who shall in due course pass the examination of Bachelor of Laws of the University of Sydney.

Examination of solicitor.

12. A Solicitor, of not less than five years' practice, may proceed to examination under Appendices A and B without having his name struck off the Roll of Solicitors.

LL.B. Degree.

13. The final examination for the degree of Bachelor of Laws of the University of Sydney, if such examination be in the same subjects and include the books mentioned in Appendix C, shall for all purposes be deemed to be an examination under Appendix C: Provided that all notices shall be given, and fees paid as required by these Rules in the case of a student-at-law proceeding to final examination.

14. Every student-at-law shall pass in all the subjects prescribed in Appendix C, and being a graduate may proceed to that examination after he shall have been a student-at-law for one year and six months; and if not a graduate, he may proceed to the said examination after he shall have been a student-at-law for two years: Provided that a Solicitor admitted student-at-law under sub-clause 5 of Rule 4, may at once proceed to the examination held under Appendix C; and in all cases such examination shall be passed within three years from admission as a student-at-law, unless the Board allow the examination at a later period.

15. The examination under Appendices A, B, and C, shall be by printed or written questions given to the candidate at the time of examination, and answered by him in writing, in the presence of the examiners or one of them and there shall be separate papers on the several subjects, containing each not less than twelve nor more than eighteen questions, and in respect of the Classical papers and the French language, three passages for translation, of not less than fifteen nor more than twenty-five lines each from the books specified, with at least ten questions in addition having reference to the said books.

16. Not more than three hours shall be allowed for answering any one examination paper.

17. During the third Term of each year the Board shall appoint for the ensuing year the following examiners:—

1. The Professor of Law of the University of Sydney and two practising barristers for the examinations under Appendix C.
2. A practising barrister, or such other person as the Board may approve, for the examinations under Appendix B.
3. Two or more professors of the University of Sydney, or such other persons as the Board may approve, for the examinations under Appendix A.

And all such examiners shall continue to act beyond the year for which they have been appointed unless others shall have been appointed by the Board in their stead: Provided that in any case of vacancy, or upon any special occasion, the Board may at any time appoint another examiner, either generally or *pro hac vice*, as the case may require.

18. As soon as possible after any examination the examiners shall transmit to the Secretary the questions and answers in the case of each candidate, together with a report, which shall state whether the answers have or have not been "satisfactory" or "very satisfactory" in each subject. And at the first meeting of the Board after such reports have been received by the Secretary the Board shall consider the same, and shall then or on some day of adjournment determine as to the sufficiency or otherwise of the candidate's proficiency in the subjects of the examination to which the reports shall relate.

19. If in any examination under Appendix A the answers of the candidate have been "unsatisfactory" as to only one subject and "very satisfactory" as to any three of the

20. If a candidate fail to pass the examination in Appendix A, B, or C, the Board may upon his application admit him to a second examination during the next ensuing term. But after such second examination no further application for examination shall be entertained until six months shall have elapsed from the last failure.

21. If in any examination under Appendix C the answers Admissions, of the candidate have not been "satisfactory" as to at least &c. four, or "very satisfactory" as to at least three of the subjects, a second examination, if allowed by the Board, shall extend to all the subjects.

22. As soon as a candidate shall have fulfilled all the Fees. requirements of these Rules the Board shall certify that he is eligible for admission to the Bar and he shall be admitted and sworn in in open Court on any day following, in Term, by any two judges sitting together. No admission will be made under these Rules unless the person applying be present in Court in person, and immediately after admission each barrister shall sign the Roll.

23. At the time of applying for admission to any examination or re-examination each candidate shall pay the following fees:—

Under Appendix A—Twenty guineas, or if French be taken up, thirty guineas.

Under Appendix B—Ten guineas.

Under Appendix C—Twenty guineas.

Under Appendix C—Five guineas if for re-examination in one subject only.

And at the same time, and upon application for admission as a student-at-law, shall pay a fee of one guinea to the Secretary, which shall be retained by him. And all such fees shall be paid to the Secretary and certified by him to the Board as so paid before the candidate shall be admitted to any examination.

24. The Board may appoint the Chief Clerk of the Secretary Supreme Court, or such other person as may be approved, to act as Secretary to the Board, and such Secretary shall attend all meetings of the Board, keep minutes of all its proceedings, conduct its correspondence, and perform such other duties as the Board may require.

RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS OF THE SUPREME COURTS OF VICTORIA AND QUEENSLAND.

(Under 46 Victoria No. 2.)

In the Supreme Court of New South Wales.

REGULA GENERALIS.

Tuesday, the 1st day of May, in the year of Our Lord 1883.

ANY person duly admitted to practise as a Barrister in the Supreme Court of Victoria or of Queensland, shall be entitled to be admitted to practise as a Barrister of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, on the following terms and conditions:—

1. The Barrister applying for admission under this rule shall produce a certificate under the hand of the Chief Justice of the Court in which he was admitted, setting forth the fact of his admission as a barrister, and recommending him as a fit and proper person to be admitted a barrister of this Court.

2. Before the application shall be granted the applicant shall pay into the hands of the Prothonotary the sum of £25, to be expended in aid of the Supreme Court library.

3. The motion for admission must be made in open Court during term, and the applicant must be present in Court at the time.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT RELATING TO THE ADMISSION OF ATTORNEYS.

(N.B.—The additional and amending Rules referred to are
printed at the end of these Rules.)

REGULÆ GENERALES.

Tuesday, the 18th day of December, A.D. 1877.

1. So soon as these Rules shall come into operation all former Rules relating to the admission of persons to appear and act as Attorneys, Solicitors, and Proctors of the Supreme Court of New South Wales shall be repealed.

2. The designation "Solicitor" shall, in these Rules, and in all future proceedings and notices or otherwise, be deemed to comprise Attorneys and Proctors as well as Solicitors.

Admission of Solicitors.

3. The following persons only shall be eligible to be admitted as Solicitors of the Court :—(a)

1st. Persons actually admitted as Attorneys or Solicitors of the Courts of England or Ireland, and Writers to the Signet of Scotland, and having actually resided in this Colony for the preceding three months.

2nd. The Attorneys, Solicitors, and Proctors (having actually resided in this Colony for the preceding three months) of any of the other Australasian Colonies of Great Britain wherein a standard of qualification substantially equal to that of this Colony shall, in the opinion of the Judges of this Court, have been adopted and acted upon, and wherein corresponding eligibility for the admission of the practitioners of this Court to the Courts of such Colonies shall have been established.

3rd. Persons having been articulated to some practising Solicitor in New South Wales, and having served the term of five years' clerkship, or if a Bachelor of Arts or Master of Arts as hereinafter mentioned previous to entering into articles, the term of three years' clerkship, and having passed the examinations required by these Rules: Provided that such persons may serve for any part of such term not exceeding one year with the Sydney Agent of such Solicitor without assignment, and such service with such Sydney Agent shall be equivalent to service for the same time with such Solicitor under the original articles: Provided also that such Sydney Agent shall be required to answer such questions and give such certificates as he would have been required to answer and give if such person had actually served him under articles of assignment. (b)

4th. Persons who having been articled to an Attorney or Solicitor of one of the Queen's Superior Courts of Great Britain or Ireland, or to a Writer to the Signet in Scotland, shall have served the full term of years required under such articles, and shall have passed the Intermediate Examinations in England, Ireland, or Scotland, as the case may be; or who, having been so articulated, and having served for any period of time shall complete the residue of the full term of years as Clerk to a Solicitor of this Court; or who, having been duly articulated and served as aforesaid in New South Wales, shall complete the residue of such term with any solicitor of the Superior Courts in England or Ireland, or with a Writer to the Signet in Scotland; and who in the two last-mentioned cases shall have passed the requisite Intermediate Examinations either in this Colony or in England, Ireland, or Scotland: Provided that in all cases within this clause, the final examinations required by these Rules shall be passed before the Board of Examiners to be appointed hereunder.(a)

5th. Persons who at the time of the passing of these Rules have completed, or who have commenced and shall complete the term of five years of clerkship in the Office of the Supreme Court or the Office of the Crown Solicitor, and shall pass the Final Examination required by these Rules, for the purposes of which examinations such persons shall be deemed to be articulated Clerks within the Rules hereinafter contained relating thereto.

Articled Clerks.

4. No Solicitor of the Court shall be allowed to have more than three articulated Clerks at one time; and before any person shall be articulated with a view to his admission as a Solicitor of this Court, he shall be introduced to the Judges by his intended master, who shall produce satisfactory certificates of the character and fitness of such person to be admitted to Articles with such view; and such person shall not be less than seventeen years of age, and shall be approved of by the Judges before entering into Articles.

5. Every person desirous of entering into Articles of Clerkship, who shall not have taken the Degree of Bachelor of Arts or Master of Arts in the University of Sydney, or other University, as provided by the Act of the Legislature passed in the 22nd year of Her Majesty, number 23, shall, before approval of such Articles, produce to the Prothonotary a Certificate of his having passed a Matriculation Examination (b) in the said University, or in some other University recognised by it; or a Certificate from the Registrar of the University of Sydney, of his having passed some equivalent Examination

before Professors or Examiners appointed by the Senate thereof; or a Certificate of his having passed, in England, Scotland, or Ireland, the Preliminary Examination which articted Clerks may be there required to pass, and shall lodge with the said Prothonotary a copy of such Certificate.(a)

6. Every future Articted Clerk shall, after he shall have entered into Articles, and during his term of Clerkship, pass two Intermediate Examinations, with an interval of at least one year between each, in the subjects of History and Law respectively—such Examination in History to be by such Professor or Examiner as the Senate of the University of Sydney, or this Court may appoint in that behalf; and such Examination in Law to be by the Board of Examiners appointed under these Rules, and to have relation to the Laws of Real and Personal Property as set forth in the following works, that is to say, "Williams on Real Property," and "Williams on Personal Property": Provided that in the case of Masters of Arts or Bachelors of Arts, as hereinbefore mentioned, no intermediate Examination otherwise than in Law shall be required.

7. No person who was articted previous to the passing of these Rules, nor any person who at the time of the passing thereof shall have completed, or shall have commenced and shall hereafter complete the term of five years of clerkship in the Office of the Supreme Court or of the Crown Solicitor, shall be required to pass any other but the Final Examination required by these Rules. But any such person may, if he shall think fit, submit to either or both of the intermediate examinations mentioned in the last preceding Rule.

8. No person during the time he shall be articted to a Solicitor with a view to his admission, shall pursue any profession, trade, or business, other than the proper business of a Solicitor.

Examiners and Examinations.

9. All Examinations in Law, both Intermediate and Final, shall be by a Board consisting of two Barristers and four Solicitors to be annually appointed by the Court, of which Board any three shall be a quorum; and all members of such Board shall continue in office until their successors shall have been appointed.

10. No future Articted Clerk shall be admitted to the Final Examinations until an interval of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed after he shall have passed the Second Intermediate Examination required by these Rules.

11. If any Articted Clerk shall fail to pass at an Examination required of him, whether Intermediate or Final, he may from time to time apply for and shall be allowed a Re-examination after three calendar months from any such failure. (a)

12. No Articted Clerk shall be admitted to practise unless he shall produce Certificates of his having passed to the satisfaction of the Examiners in all the Examinations required of him by these Rules.

13. The Board shall appoint one day at least in every Term for holding an Intermediate Examination in Law.

14. Final Examinations shall be held at the Supreme Court House, on such days, being within the last ten days of every Term, as the Board of Examiners shall appoint.

15. Every person applying for Examination shall attend the said Board of Examiners at the Supreme Court House, at such time or times as shall be appointed for that purpose by the said Board.

16. Persons applying for Final Examination in law shall submit to be examined by the said Board, and must pass, in four at least of the following branches of the Law :—

1. Real Property and Conveyancing.
2. Common Law.
3. Equity, Divorce and Matrimonial, and Ecclesiastical Law.
4. Criminal Law.
5. Practice of the Supreme Court in Insolvency.
6. Jurisdiction and practice of the Inferior Courts.

17. The Board of Examiners shall from time to time, with the approval of the Judges, notify the Books and portions of books in which they intend, after not less than six months thereafter, to conduct the Final Examinations in Law.

18. If the Examiner conducting the Examination of an Articled Clerk in History, under these Rules, shall be satisfied with the answers given by him, he shall certify the same under his hand in the following terms, viz. :—

To the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court :

I being the Examiner appointed to conduct the Examination in History of A.B. as a Solicitor's Articled Clerk, do hereby certify that I have examined the said A.B. in History, and that he has passed a satisfactory Examination therein.

19. If the Examiners, or the major part of the Examiners, conducting an Intermediate Examination in Law, shall be satisfied with the answers given by the candidate at such Examination, the said Examiners, or the major part of them; shall certify the same under their hands in the following form; viz. :—

In the Supreme Court of }
New South Wales. }

In pursuance of the Rules of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, we, being the major part of the Examiners conducting the Intermediate Examination in Law of A.B., as an Articled Clerk, do hereby certify that we have examined the said A.B. in the Laws of Real and Personal Property, at an Intermediate Examination held on the day of , as required by the said Rules, and that the said A.B. has passed the said Examination to our satisfaction.

20. If the Examiners, or major part of the Examiners, conducting a Final Examination, shall be satisfied as to the fitness and capacity of the candidate, and that he has complied in all respects with these Rules, the said Examiners, or the major part of them, shall certify the same under their hands, in the following form, viz. :—

In the Supreme Court of }
New South Wales. }

IN pursuance of the Rules of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, we, being the Examiners (or major part of the Examiners) conducting the Final Examination of A.B. as an Articled Clerk, do hereby certify that we have examined the said A.B. as required by the said Rules, and we find that the said A.B. has complied with all the conditions prescribed, and has passed all the Examinations required by the Rules of this Honorable Court. And we do testify that the said A.B. is fit and capable to act as a Solicitor of the said Court.—Dated this day of

21. The Chief Clerk of the Supreme Court, or such other person as the Judges may from time to time appoint, shall be and act as Secretary to the Board of Examiners, and shall attend all meetings of the Board and keep minutes of all its proceedings and conduct its correspondence, and perform such other duties as the Board may require.

22. Every Articled Clerk shall, before being admitted to either of the Intermediate Examinations hereby required, pay into the hands of the Prothonotary an Examination Fee of *Five* pounds, and shall also, before admission to his Final Examination in Law, pay a fee of *Ten* pounds. (a) And such respective fees shall be by such Prothonotary paid rateably to the Examiners by whom the respective Examinations shall be conducted. (b)

Notices, &c.

23. Every Articled Clerk desirous of being examined at an Intermediate Examination shall give notice in writing of such his desire to the Prothonotary, before the commencement of the Term during which he desires to be examined.

24. Every person not previously admitted as a Solicitor, and desirous of being admitted under any of the last three clauses of Rule 3, shall, in addition to the notices hereafter required, give at the least one month's notice to the Board of Examiners of his intention to apply for Final Examination, by leaving the notice with the Prothonotary, which notice shall also state his place or places of residence, and service for the last two years; and before any such person shall be admitted, he shall procure the Certificate of the Examiners of his having passed the Final Examination required by these Rules.

25. Any person previously admitted as aforesaid, and desirous of being admitted under either of the first two clauses of Rule 3, shall at the time of giving the notice hereafter required, file with the Prothonotary the Affidavit on which he seeks for admission, together with the Certificate of his previous admission, which Affidavit shall contain the following allegations, viz. :—Deponent's admission in one of the aforesaid Courts (a); that he has not done or committed any act or thing which would cause his name to be struck off the Roll of the said Court; and that to the best of his knowledge and belief his name still remains on the said Roll; that the copy of the Certificate annexed to his said affidavit is a true copy of his admission, and that he is the person named therein; the time when he ceased to practise; the time of his arrival in the Colony; that he has actually resided in this Colony for the preceding three months, the mode of his employment from the time he ceased to practise, and a reference to one or more respectable householder or householders resident within the Colony, to whom he is known; and the Rule (b) for the admission of such last-mentioned person shall be drawn up on reading such Affidavit, which Rule shall be conditional for twelve months, unless the Judges shall see cause to the contrary.

26. Every person who shall intend to apply for admission as a Solicitor of this Court (whether previously admitted elsewhere or not) shall, before the commencement of the Term in which he shall so apply, cause his name and place of abode, written in legible character, to be affixed in the Office of the Supreme Court, and also in the vestibule of the Court-house; and shall also cause notice of his intended application to be three several times published in two public newspapers of Sydney, during such Term, and no admission shall take place except only on the last day of such Term.

27. Every person applying at the expiration of his Articles to be admitted a Solicitor of the Court shall, before the commencement of the Term in which he is desirous of being admitted, leave or cause to be left with the Prothonotary his Articles of Clerkship (c), and also any assignment which may have been made thereof, and the Certificates of his having passed the required Examinations, together with answers to the several questions in the Appendix hereunto annexed, signed by the applicant, and also by the Solicitor or Solicitors with whom he shall have served his clerkship, and by two respectable householders to whom he is personally known. (d)

28. In case the applicant shall show sufficient cause to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners why the preceding regulation cannot be fully complied with, it shall be in the power of the said Board, upon sufficient proof being given of the same, to dispense with any part of the said regulation that they may think fit or reasonable. (e)

29. Every person applying for admission shall also, if required, sign and leave, or cause to be left, with the Prothonotary, answers in writing to such other written or printed questions as shall be proposed by the Board of Examiners touching his service and conduct; and shall also, if required, attend the said Board personally for the purpose of giving further explanations touching the same; and shall also, if required, procure the attendance of the Solicitor or Solicitors with whom he shall have served his clerkship as aforesaid; and also, if required, procure the attendance of such other person or persons as the Board may direct, to answer either personally or in writing any questions touching such service or conduct, or shall make proof to the satisfaction of the said Board of his inability to procure the same.

Miscellaneous.

30. Every Solicitor having been admitted on the Roll of this Court and ceasing to practise for twelve months continuously may be struck off the Roll, and shall not be readmitted without a Term's notice of his intention to apply for such re-admission; and at the time of giving such notice shall cause to be filed the Affidavit on which he seeks to be readmitted, with the Prothonotary, which Affidavit shall contain, in addition to the particulars now required, a statement of his place or places of abode, during the last preceding year, and how he has employed his time since he ceased to practise; and the rule for readmission of such person shall be drawn up on reading such Affidavit.

31. No Solicitor of the Court shall employ as a clerk, assistant, or writer, in or about his business as a Solicitor, any person who hath been or who shall be convicted of any felony or of wilful and corrupt perjury, or subornation of perjury, or common barratry.

32. Nothing in these Rules contained shall in any way interfere with, alter, or prejudice the authority of the Court to suspend or remove from the Rolls of Solicitors any person who shall, in the opinion of the Court, have been guilty of misconduct or of malpractice justifying such suspension or removal.

Commencement of Rules.

33. These Rules shall come into force on the first day of January, A.D. 1878, save only so far as they relate to the Matriculation Examinations or their equivalent as required by these Rules; the provisions in respect of which shall not come into operation until after the next Matriculation and Public Examinations of the University of Sydney.

4. Has the said A.B. during the whole term of his clerkship, with the exception above mentioned, been faithfully and diligently employed in your professional business of a Solicitor?

5. What has been the moral conduct, character, and habits of the said A.B. during the time he has served under his articles?

6. Do you consider the said A.B. a fit and proper person to be a Solicitor of the Supreme Court?

7. Has the said A.B. since the expiration of his articles been engaged and concerned, and for how long a time, in any, and what profession, trade, or business, other than the profession of a Solicitor?

REGULA GENERALIS.

In addition to the Examination Fees which are by the 22nd of the Rules of the 18th December, 1877, made payable by Articled Clerks, there shall be paid a fee of five pounds for any Matriculation Examination or equivalent Examination by the Professors or Examiners of the University of Sydney which any Candidate for Articles shall pass under the said Rules; and such fee shall be paid into the hands of the Prothonotary in time to enable him to transmit the same to the University Registrar, together with a list of Candidates for Examination, not less than seven days prior to that appointed for the holding of any such Examination: Provided that this Rule shall not apply to any University Student who shall have matriculated, and shall have attended the University Course of Lectures for one whole Academic year.

ANY person who shall be or shall have been conditionally admitted a Solicitor for twelve months in pursuance of the twenty-fifth rule of the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, shall, three months previous to the expiration of such twelve months, serve written notices on the Prothonotary and on the Secretary of the Incorporated Law Institute of his intention to apply to the Court to have such conditional admittance confirmed, and at the time of serving such notice on the Prothonotary, he shall file an affidavit in which he shall depose that he has not been engaged or occupied at any time since his conditional admission in any profession, business, pursuit, or calling, other than that of a Solicitor, and that he has not committed or omitted, or been privy to or cognizant of any act, matter, or thing disintitling him to such confirmation. And in case such conditional admission be not confirmed, and the rule drawn up accordingly at the expiration of such twelve months, the said conditional admission shall cease to operate after that time, unless the Judges shall in any case see cause to the contrary.

THE third sub-clause of Rule three of the Rules relating to the admission of Attorneys, made on the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following sub-clause is hereby made and shall be read as sub-clause three :—

“3rd. Persons having been articulated to a practising Solicitor in New South Wales, and having served the term of five years’ clerkship, or if they have taken a degree in a University as hereinafter mentioned previously to entering into articles, the term of three years’ clerkship, and having passed the examinations required by these Rules : Provided that such persons may serve for any part of such term not exceeding one year with the Sydney agent of such Solicitor without assignment, and such service with such Sydney agent shall be equivalent to service for the same time with such Solicitor under the original articles : Provided also that such Sydney agent shall be required to answer such questions and give such certificates as he would have been required to answer and give if such person had actually served him under articles of assignment.”

And Rule five of the said Rules is also hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Rule is hereby made and shall be read as Rule five :—

“5. Every person desirous of entering into articles of clerkship who shall not have taken a degree in the University of Sydney, or in some other University recognized by it, shall, before approval of such articles, produce to the Prothonotary a certificate of his having passed a Matriculation Examination in the said University, or in some other University recognized by it, or a certificate from the Registrar of the University of Sydney of his having passed some equivalent Examination before Professors or Examiners appointed by the Senate thereof, or a certificate of his having passed in England, Scotland, or Ireland the preliminary Examination which articulated clerks may be there required to pass, and shall lodge with the said Prothonotary a copy of such certificate.”

Whereas it appearing that certain Solicitors coming from places beyond the Colony had not received timely notice of the promulgation of Rule one, relating to the admission of Solicitors, made on the twenty-sixth day of September last, it is hereby ordered that the provision contained in the said Rule for the payment of a fee of forty guineas shall not operate in respect of Solicitors coming from any of the Australasian Colonies, who shall be conditionally admitted during the First Term of this year, nor in respect of Solicitors coming from places other than the Australasian Colonies, who shall be conditionally admitted during the Second Term of this year.

2. The fourth sub-clause of the Rule three of the Rules relating to the admission of Solicitors, made on the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following sub-clause is hereby made, and shall be read as sub-clause four:—

- 4th. *a.* Persons who, having been articulated to an Attorney or Solicitor of one of the Queen's Superior Courts of Great Britain or Ireland, or to a Writer to the Signet in Scotland, shall have served the full term of years required under such articles, and shall have passed the Intermediate Examinations in England, Ireland, or Scotland, as the case may be; or
- b.* Persons who, having been articulated to a Solicitor of one of the Queen's Superior Courts of Great Britain or Ireland, or to a Writer to the Signet in Scotland, or to a Solicitor of this Court, shall serve under assignment or re-assignment any portion or portions of their articles either in England, Ireland, or Scotland, or in this Colony, and shall complete the residue of their articles either in England, Ireland, or Scotland, or in this Colony:

Provided that in the cases under section *b* of this sub-clause the requisite *Intermediate Examinations* may be passed either in this Colony or in England, Ireland, or Scotland, and that the time occupied in travelling between this Colony and Great Britain, Ireland, or Scotland, shall be made up by service under articles which may be extended for the requisite period. And provided also that in all cases within this sub-clause the *Final Examinations* required by these Rules shall be passed before the Board of Examiners appointed hereunder. And this sub-clause shall take effect as from the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

EXAMINATIONS will be held at St. Paul, St. John, and St. Andrew's Colleges, commencing at half-past 9 o'clock on 8th March, 17th May, 16th August, and 15th November.

The subjects for examination at St. Paul and St. Andrew's Colleges will be:—

Hallam's “Constitutional History of England,” chapters I to XIV inclusive; Green's “Short History of the English People,” from chapter VI, section 1, to chapter IX, section 7, inclusive.

The subjects for examination at St. John's College will be:—

Burke's “Abridgment of Lingard's History of England.”

Those portions of Parts III, IV, V, and VI of Fredet's “Ancient History,” which contain the History of Rome.

Notice of intention to proceed to the History Examination should be lodged with the Prothonotary at latest *before* the beginning of the Term during which the examination will be held. The notice should state the name of the candidate *in full*, and the name of the College. The amount of the fees, £5 10s. 6d., should accompany the notice.

Preliminary Examination for Articled Clerks.

In accordance with the regulations of the Supreme Court, candidates are required to pass an examination in the subjects of the Matriculation Examination.

Examinations are held at the University in the months of April, July, and November, commencing on the first Monday in the months of July and November, and on the first Tuesday in the month of April.

The authors set for the Examinations in April, 1893, are the same as those prescribed for the Matriculation Examination in March, 1893.

For the Examinations in July and November, 1893, and April, 1894, the authors are the same as those set for the Matriculation Examination of March, 1894, and so on in future years.

The fees for this Examination (£5 10s. 6d.) are payable to the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court, whose receipt must be forwarded to the Registrar of the University not less than seven days before the first day of examination.

Candidates for the Law Matriculation Examination will accordingly find it indispensable to acquaint themselves with the following information in reference to the ordinary Matriculation Examination.

Candidates for Matriculation are required to pass a satisfactory Examination in Latin, Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, and one of the following subjects:—Greek, French, German. Proficiency in writing English is also taken into account.

Compulsory Subjects.

1. LATIN.—Translation into English of passages from set authors and of Latin passages at sight, and translation of simple English sentences into Latin. Subject set for 1893: Cicero pro Murena. Candidates are expected to show an accurate knowledge of Latin accidence.
2. ARITHMETIC.
3. ALGEBRA.—To quadratic equations involving one unknown quantity.
4. GEOMETRY.—Euclid, Books I, II, and III.

Optional Subjects.
