## RÈGLES GÉNÉRALES.

The following Rules are hereby established, for the despatch of business in the Supreme Court, during the year 1905 :—

### TERMS, HOLIDAYS, SITTINGS, AND VACATIONS.

1. The Terms, Holidays, Vacations, Circuits, and Sittings of the Court shall be those mentioned in the Law Almanac annexed hereto.

### PRECEDENCE OF BUSINESS.

2. Subject to the direction of the Court, Motions *Nisi* for New Trials will, on every day except *Friday*, have precedence of all other business. On *Fridays* Criminal and other Crown Cases will have precedence. On *Mondays* and on *Thursdays* Motions generally will have precedence, then appeals in cases of emergency in interlocutory motions in the Equity, Bankruptcy, Probate, and Matrimonial Causes jurisdictions; then Motions on Notice, and then Motions. On *Tuesdays* and *Wednesdays* New Trial Motions will be heard. On *Fridays* Demurrers, Special Cases, and District Court Appeals will be heard. By leave of the Court, Common Motions may be taken on any day.

### CROWN CASES RESERVED.

3. Special Cases reserved on any Criminal Trial, when received by the Prothonotary, shall be set down for hearing on the next ensuing Friday on which the Court shall sit, unless a Judge shall otherwise order.

### EQUITY, BANKRUPTCY, PROBATE, AND MATRIMONIAL CAUSES APPEALS.

4. Equity, Bankruptcy, Probate, and Matrimonial Causes Appeals may be set down for, and will take precedence on, the Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of the second and of each alternate week during Term. Appeals in interlocutory motions in these jurisdictions may, in case of emergency, be heard on any Monday or Thursday in Term.

### EQUITY.

5. The Chief Judge in Equity will sit for the hearing of Causes on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, at 11 o'clock; for the hearing of Motions and Petitions on Monday and Wednesday, from 10 to 11 o'clock; in Chambers, for Chamber applications, on Tuesday, from 10 to 11 o'clock; for Lunacy matters, on Thursday, from 10 to 11 o'clock; and for Motions, Petitions, adjourned Summonses, Decrees on further directions, Motions for Decree, Demurrers, Special Cases, Short Causes, and other similar matters, on Friday, from 10 o'clock.

### PROBATE, BANKRUPTCY, AND COMPANY MATTERS.

6. Applications for Probates and Letters of Administration and other non-contentious Probate matters will be taken by the Probate Judge on Friday at 10 o'clock, or at such other times as he shall appoint. All other Probate matters will be taken by the Probate Judge at such times as he shall appoint.

The Judge in Bankruptcy will, unless he shall otherwise appoint, take all Company matters on Tuesday at 10 o'clock, and the general bankruptcy business as follows:—Motions under Section 134 on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday; all other matters on Wednesday and Thursday, at 10 o'clock.

#### **CHAMBER BUSINESS.**

7. Chamber Business at Law will be taken on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, at 10 o'clock, except during the sittings for the trial of Causes and during Term, when the Chamber business will be taken at 9:30 a.m.: Provided that a summons may be returnable on any other day by order of a Judge.

#### **SATURDAYS.**

8. There will be no sitting of the Court in Sydney (except for the trial of Prisoners and except the last day of Term) on any Saturday: Provided that any argument or trial, not concluded on Friday, may be continued on Saturday, if the Court or presiding Judge thinks fit.

### **GENERAL RULES APPLICABLE TO EVERY YEAR.**

#### **CONFIRMATION OF ORDERS.**

314. Notice must be given to the Prothonotary, on or before the Saturday preceding the commencement of each Term, of all intended applications for confirmation by the Court of orders made under and by virtue of Section 20 of the Act 1900, No. 35.

#### **SETTING DOWN CAUSES AT LAW.**

106. For each day of the Sittings for Causes there shall be three separate Cause Lists, which shall be taken respectively in the Banco and in No. 1 and No. 2 Jury Courts.

107. To the extent limited for each day as next mentioned, causes shall be set down consecutively only. No more than four causes shall be set down for any day for trial in Sydney by a Judge without a Jury, or by a Jury of four persons, nor more than one cause for trial by a Jury of twelve: Provided that an additional number of causes, not exceeding two, may be set down for any day, if the Prothonotary sees fit.

108. Until all Lists have been filled, in accordance with the last preceding Rule, no cause shall, except by leave of the Prothonotary, be set down in any List for any subsequent day.

#### **JURIES OF TWELVE.**

109. Provided that causes for trial by juries of twelve shall be set down for such days only as the Prothonotary shall in each case direct.

#### **TRANSFERRING CAUSES.**

110. Causes, on the List of any Court, may be transferred to the List of any other, by order of a Judge, for trial on the day next but one following, or any later day: Provided that no such day shall be earlier than that for which the cause was first entered.

### CAUSES ON CIRCUIT.

111. Causes for trial in any Circuit Court shall be entered for the day fixed in the Law Almanac for holding such Circuit Court. But whenever it appears to the Chief Justice, or to the Judge intending to hold any Circuit Court, that it will not be convenient to hear the civil causes (if any) set down for trial at that Court on the day so fixed, the Chief Justice, or such Judge, may, not less than sixteen days before the day so fixed, appoint some other day for the trial of such causes, by direction to the Prothonotary; and the Prothonotary shall thereupon forthwith give notice of such appointment to the solicitors in the said causes or to their town agents, and also to the Sheriff; and all notices already given between the parties shall hold good and be applied to the day so specially appointed, and all notices and subpoenas to be thereafter given or issued shall be given or issued for that day.

127. If no civil cause has been set down and notice of trial given and notified to the Prothonotary for any Circuit Court, up to the sixteenth day before the day named in the Law Almanac for the time being for the trial of civil causes thereat, no jury shall be summoned to such Court for the trial of civil issues without the leave of a Judge, and the Prothonotary shall give notice to the Sheriff accordingly.

### POSTPONEMENT.

113. When any Sittings for causes are postponed, the date for the trial of any cause, specially fixed, shall also be postponed for the same number of days as that for which the Sittings have been postponed, unless a Judge shall otherwise order.

### CAUSES UNCONCLUDED DURING THE SITTINGS.

145. Any cause, not concluded on the last day of the Sittings, may be continued on such day or days as the presiding Judge shall think fit.

### REMANETS.

114. All causes remaining untried at any sittings shall be set down by the Prothonotary, each according to its appropriate list for the then next Sittings; and no new notice of trial, or to produce documents, shall be necessary. Every such cause shall have precedence over causes previously set down for those Sittings.

### MEMORANDUM FOR NEW TRIAL.

150. Where either party intends to move for a nonsuit, or for a new trial, or in arrest of judgment, or for judgment *non obstante veredicto*, or for a *reuire de novo*, or to enter a verdict, or to increase or reduce the amount of the verdict, whether on any point reserved at the trial or not, he shall within eight days (or in causes tried at a circuit town, or at a District Court above 100 miles from Sydney, within fourteen days), after the trial file a memorandum of such intention, together with all affidavits to be used in support of the motion, and shall at the same time lodge with the Prothonotary three additional copies of such memorandum: Provided that any such affidavit may be filed afterwards by leave of the Court or a Judge.

**MOTIONS NISI FOR NEW TRIAL.**

153. All causes in which such memorandum has been filed shall be entered in the order of filing; and except as herein-after provided shall be called on in that order on every day in Term until disposed of.

154. Provided that no matter in which printed copies of the Judge's notes have under these Rules to be lodged, shall be called on for hearing before the expiration of the time allowed for lodging such copies, except by direction of the Court or a Judge at the request of the moving party; and that where the cause has ended during the term, or within four days preceding the term, no motion in pursuance of such memorandum need be made earlier than the fourth day after the filing thereof.

**PARTIES NOT READY TO PROCEED.**

158. Where a memorandum for a new trial has been filed, or a rule nisi in pursuance thereof granted, if no motion is made when the case is called on, such case shall (unless the Court extends the time) be struck out of the paper, with leave to the adverse party to sign judgment.

**RULES NISI FOR NEW TRIAL.**

156. Every rule nisi for a new trial shall be taken out, filed, and served within seven days after it has been granted, and at the time of filing, three additional copies shall be lodged with the Prothonotary; otherwise it shall be held to have lapsed, and the Prothonotary shall thereupon strike the case out of the Term Book.

**TERM BOOK.**

316. The Prothonotary shall keep a book to be called the Term Book, in which shall be entered every rule nisi for a new trial as soon as granted, and every other matter for argument in Term, according to its priority in the date of filing.

318. Subject to any Rules regulating the precedence of business, every matter shall come on for hearing in the order in which it is entered in the Term Book.

**MOTIONS FOR RULES ABSOLUTE.**

329. In prohibition matters under the Justices Act, 1902, and on motions to make any rule absolute, the moving party shall begin and the party showing cause follow, and one counsel only shall be heard in reply. And before the opening any affidavits in support of the rule shall be read unless the Court otherwise orders.

**VACATION BUSINESS.**

9. During the Long Vacation, from the commencement thereof to the 31st January following, both days inclusive, except as in the next Rule provided, time shall not run in any jurisdiction of the Court, nor shall any business other than that specified in such Rule be taken without the leave of a Judge; but time shall run after the said 31st January, and throughout the Short Vacation.

10. During the Long Vacation, from the commencement thereof to the 31st January following, both days inclusive—

- (a) In any action in which the Writ has been specially indorsed under the 24th section of the Common Law Procedure Act, 1899, all steps and proceedings may be taken and time shall run at Law.



- (b) Causes may be set down, and notices of trial and to admit or produce documents may be given.
- (c) All Writs may be issued, executed, and returned.
- (d) Judgment may be signed in all cases in which the time which must expire before the same can be signed has expired before vacation begins.
- (e) Time shall run for putting in, excepting to and justifying bail.
- (f) Costs may be taxed in any case if the Taxing Officers deem it necessary.
- (g) All necessary proceedings may be taken for the purposes of an Appeal, or for obtaining or dissolving any injunction.
- (h) Summonses in cases of emergency may be returnable in Chambers on any Wednesday, or such other day as a Judge shall appoint.

Every memorandum for a new trial must be filed within the time limited by these Rules notwithstanding Vacation.

#### CHAMBER BUSINESS.

310. Every Summons returnable in Chambers shall be served on the party whose attendance is required before one o'clock of the afternoon preceding the return day, or if returnable on Monday before one o'clock of the preceding Friday afternoon, unless a Judge otherwise orders.

336. No Chamber application will be entertained on any day in or out of Term, except in cases of emergency, after one o'clock.

## ROYAL FAMILY OF THE UNITED KINGDOM.

ALBERT EDWARD, King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, eldest son of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria; born Nov. 9, 1841; succeeded to the throne on the decease of his mother, Queen Victoria, Jan. 22, 1901; proclaimed Jan. 24, 1901; married March 10, 1863, to Princess Alexandra of Denmark. *Issue*—[Albert Victor Christian Edward, born Jan. 8, 1864; died Jan. 14, 1892. George Frederick Ernest Albert, Prince of Wales, born June 3, 1865; married July 6, 1893, to Princess Victoria Mary of Teck. **RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS.**

(Under Act 1898, No. 22.)

New South Wales to wit.

Thursday, the 24th day of September, A.D. 1891.

WE, the Honorable Sir Frederick Darley, Knight, Chief Justice, and the Honorable Sir William Charles Windeyer, Knight, the Honorable Sir Joseph George Long Innes, Knight, the Honorable Matthew Henry Stephen, the Honorable William Owen, the Honorable William John Foster, and the Honorable Charles James Manning, being the present Judges of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, with the Honorable George Bowen Simpson, Queen's Counsel, the Attorney-General for the time being of the said Colony, and the Honorable Charles Edward Pilcher, Queen's Counsel, and George Houstoun Reid, Esquire, the two barristers elected in the month of December last, according to the Act 11 Victoria No. 57, being the Board constituted under the said Act for the approval of properly qualified persons to be barristers of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, do, by virtue of the provisions of the said Act and of the Act 39 Victoria No. 32, hereby repeal all Rules now subsisting under the said Acts or either of them, except in respect of matters done or commenced to be done thereunder; and we do, in pursuance of the said Acts, make and promulgate the following Rules for the examination and admission of candidates who shall hereafter apply to be admitted barristers of the said Supreme Court under the said Acts: Provided always, that the provision contained in these Rules shall be deemed to apply to all persons admitted as Students-at-law under the Rules hereby repealed; and provided that the examiners appointed under the rules hereby repealed shall continue to examine under these rules until the end of the present year.

1. The Board shall meet in the Chambers of the Chief Justice on the first and third Wednesdays in each Term, or meetings, on such other dates as the Attorney-General may appoint.

**Qualifications of barristers.**

2. Every person, not being a barrister-at-law or advocate admitted in Great Britain or Ireland, applying for admission to the Bar, shall, before being entitled to the certificate referred to in Rule 22—

1. Have been a student-at-law for the period required and passed all examinations prescribed by these Rules; or
2. Being a graduate of the University of Sydney, admitted under sub-clause 2 of Rule 4 a student-at-law at the end of his second year, produce certificates that he has kept four Terms in one of the Inns of Court in London, and has passed all the examinations required by these Rules; or
3. Have been a Solicitor of this Court, in practice for not less than five years; have caused his name to be struck off the Roll of Solicitors before his admission as student-at-law; and have passed all examinations required by these Rules. (a)

**Application for admission to literary examination, &c.**

3. Every person applying for admission to the preliminary literary examination under Appendix A, or for admission as a student-at-law, shall give written notice to the Board, through the Attorney-General, fourteen days before the first day of any Term. Such notice shall be accompanied by certificates from two or more persons resident in the Colony, testifying that they have been well acquainted with the applicant and that he is a person of good fame and character. And the Board may require the applicant to give such further proofs as to his fame and character as it may deem necessary.

**Qualifications of students-at-law.**

4. Every applicant for admission as student-at-law shall—

1. Be a graduate in Arts of the University of Sydney or a graduate in Arts, Law, or Medicine of some University within the meaning of the Act 22 Victoria No. 23; or
2. Have passed two annual examinations at the University of Sydney, and shall thereafter in due course become a graduate of such University; (b) or
3. Have passed two annual examinations in the Arts course at the University of Sydney and the History Examination under Appendix A; or
4. Have passed the preliminary literary examination under Appendix A; or
5. Have been a Solicitor of this Court in practice for not less than five years; have caused his name to be struck off the Roll of Solicitors; and, if not exempt therefrom, have passed the examinations under Appendices A and B. (a)

**Term of studentship.**

5. Every student-at-law applying for admission to the Bar, being a graduate at the time he became a student-at-law, or becoming a graduate during his studentship, as provided for by sub-clause 2 of Rule 4, shall have been a student-at-law for at least two years; and every such applicant not being or becoming a graduate as aforesaid, shall have been a student-at-law for at least three years:



Provided, however, that a Solicitor admitted a student-at-law under sub-clause 5 of Rule 4, shall not be required to be a student-at-law for a longer period than will elapse between his admission as student-at-law and his passing the final examination in law under Appendix C: Provided also that any person who shall produce a certificate that he has kept four terms as a student-at-law of any English or Irish Inn of Court, may be allowed to count the same as equivalent to one year passed as a student-at-law under these Rules.

6. During studentship every student-at-law shall be a Residence *bona-fide* resident in this Colony, and before admission to the Bar shall make a declaration in the form in Appendix D, and submit to the Board proof, similar to that required by Rule 3, of his good fame and character: Provided, however, that the residence of a student-at-law in London when keeping his terms at an Inn of Court, under sub-clause 2 of Rule 2, shall not be held to be a contravention of this Rule.

7. Every applicant for examination in Appendices B and C shall, before the commencement of any Term, lodge with the Secretary an announcement in writing to the Board for admission to such examination, and the Secretary shall send each applicant two clear days' notice of his admission to any examination under these Rules.

8. All examinations shall be held on the second Wednesday in each Term, at such place in Sydney, and at such hour, as may be appointed by the examiners: Provided that the examiners may appoint a later date, so long as such date shall not be more than fourteen days from that mentioned in this Rule; but this limitation shall not take effect in the case of a student-at-law who is proceeding to the examination of Bachelor of Laws in the University of Sydney. (a)

9. If, for a reason to be allowed by the Board, a candidate shall not in due course have proceeded to any examination to which he shall have been admitted, he may, upon application, be readmitted to examination during the next ensuing Term: Provided that the fees under Rule 23 shall be payable on such readmission, unless the Board shall otherwise direct.

10. Every candidate for the preliminary literary examination shall pass in all the subjects prescribed in Appendix A; and the standard of proficiency required shall be equal to that of the second annual examination in the University of Sydney, so far as such standard is capable of being applied to the subjects of examination under Appendix A.

11. Every student-at-law, unless he shall satisfy the Board that he holds the degree of Bachelor of Laws of the University of Sydney, or of some University within the meaning of the Act 22 Victoria No. 23, or the degree of Bachelor of Civil Laws of the University of Oxford, or that he has passed in the First Class of the school of Jurisprudence in the University of Oxford or Cambridge, or that he has passed an examination in Roman, Inter-

national, and Constitutional Law at one of the Inns of Court in England or Ireland, shall pass an examination in all the subjects prescribed in Appendix B; and until this examination be passed he shall not be admitted to the examination prescribed in Appendix C; but this last proviso shall not apply in the case of a student-at-law who shall in due course pass the examination of Bachelor of Laws of the University of Sydney.

12. A Solicitor, of not less than five years' practice, may proceed to examination under Appendices A and B without having his name struck off the Roll of Solicitors.

13. The final examination for the degree of Bachelor of Laws of the University of Sydney, if such examination be in the same subjects and include the books mentioned in Appendix C, shall for all purposes be deemed to be an examination under Appendix C: Provided that all notices shall be given, and fees paid as required by these Rules in the case of a student-at-law proceeding to final examination. (a)

14. Every student-at-law shall pass in all the subjects prescribed in Appendix C, and being a graduate may proceed to that examination after he shall have been a student-at-law for one year and six months; and if not a graduate, he may proceed to the said examination after he shall have been a student-at-law for two years: Provided that a Solicitor admitted student-at-law under sub-clause 5 of Rule 4, may at once proceed to the examination held under Appendix C; and in all cases such examination shall be passed within three years from admission as a student-at-law, unless the Board allow the examination at a later period.

15. The examination under Appendices A, B, and C shall be by printed or written questions given to the candidate at the time of examination, and answered by him in writing, in the presence of the examiners or one of them; and there shall be separate papers on the several subjects, containing each not less than twelve nor more than eighteen questions, and in respect of the Classical papers and the French language, three passages for translation, of not less than fifteen nor more than twenty-five lines each from the books specified, with at least ten questions in addition having reference to the said books.

16. Not more than three hours shall be allowed for answering any one examination paper.

17. During the third Term of each year the Board shall appoint for the ensuing year the following examiners:—

1. The Professor of Law of the University of Sydney and two practising barristers for the examinations under Appendix C.
2. A practising barrister, or such other person as the Board may approve, for the examinations under Appendix B.
3. Two or more professors of the University of Sydney, or such other persons as the Board may approve, for the examinations under Appendix A.

And all such examiners shall continue to act beyond the year for which they have been appointed unless others shall have been appointed by the Board in their stead: Provided that in any case of vacancy, or upon any special occasion, the Board may at any time appoint another examiner, either generally or *pro hac vice*, as the case may require.

18. As soon as possible after any examination the examiners shall transmit to the Secretary the questions and answers in the case of each candidate, together with a report, which shall state whether the answers have or have not been "satisfactory" or "very satisfactory" in each subject. And at the first meeting of the Board after such reports have been received by the Secretary the Board shall consider the same, and shall then or on some day of adjournment determine as to the sufficiency or otherwise of the candidate's proficiency in the subjects of the examination to which the reports shall relate. Reports by Examiners.

19. If in any examination under Appendix A the answers of the candidate have been "unsatisfactory" as to only one subject and "very satisfactory" as to any three of the other subjects, the Board may resolve that the candidate has satisfactorily passed the said examination, anything to the contrary in Rule 10 notwithstanding. (a) Consideration of reports.

20. If a candidate fail to pass the examination in Appendix A, B, or C, the Board may upon his application admit him to a second examination during the next ensuing term. But after such second examination no further application for examination shall be entertained until six months shall have elapsed from the last failure. Second examination.

21. If in any examination under Appendix C the answers of the candidate have not been "satisfactory" as to at least four, or "very satisfactory" as to at least three of the subjects, a second examination, if allowed by the Board, shall extend to all the subjects. (b)

22. As soon as a candidate shall have fulfilled all the requirements of these Rules the Board shall certify that he is eligible for admission to the Bar, and he shall be admitted and sworn in in open Court on any day following, in Term, by any two judges sitting together. No admission will be made under these Rules unless the person applying be present in Court in person, and immediately after admission each barrister shall sign the Roll. Admissions, &c.

23. Repealed by Rule of 9th October, 1899, which provides: At the time of applying for admission to any examination or re-examination each candidate shall pay the following fees:— Fees.

Under Appendix A—Twenty guineas.

Under Appendix B—Ten guineas.

Under Appendix C—Twenty guineas.

Under Appendix C—Five guineas if for re-examination in one subject only.

And at the same time, and upon application for admission

as a student-at-law, shall pay a fee of one guinea to the Secretary, which shall be retained by him. And all such fees shall be paid to the Secretary and certified by him to the Board as so paid before the candidate shall be admitted to any examination.

Secretary.

*Notice to Candidates for the Bar Examination under Appendix C.*

1. The English text books prescribed for this Examination are, in great measure, prescribed for the purpose of indicating the scope and subject matter of the examination; but, on all subjects where the law in force in New South Wales differs from the English law, candidates are required to make themselves acquainted with the law in force in New South Wales. Text books or parts of text books which require to be read in connection with the local statutes are marked with an asterisk.

2. Candidates are reminded that English Statutes passed after the 26th July, 1828, are not in force in this State, except in cases where the enactment has been made binding by the Imperial Parliament, either expressly or by necessary implication. At the same time, a considerable number of English Statutes passed after that date (such as the English Wills Act, 1837), have been expressly adopted by the local Legislature: whilst a considerable number of other local enactments (such as the Bills of Exchange Act, 1887) are based on similar enactments passed in the United Kingdom. As to how far law in force in England prior to the 26th July, 1828 applies in New South Wales, reference may be made to Webb's "Imperial Law." As to how far English Statutes have been adopted by, or embodied in, local legislation, reference may be made to Curlewis' "Table of Statutes."

3. In cases where local Statutes are expressly prescribed as subjects for examination, the examination will be confined, so far as possible, to the general tenor and essential, or more important, provisions of the Statutes referred to: or, in other words, to such matters as would find a place in a student's text book. The English text book will serve, to some extent, as a guide in this matter. Candidates may also obtain a few copies of previous papers, for the purpose of guidance, on applying to the Secretary to the Board.

4. Candidates are reminded that the State Laws on some of the subjects included in these examinations are liable to be superseded by Federal Legislation: whilst on other subjects the existing Acts are likely to be displaced by Consolidated Acts. Candidates are further reminded that they are liable to be examined in any Acts or Rules relating to the subjects of these examinations passed or made by either the State or the Federal Parliament more than six calendar months prior to the date at which such examinations may be held.

5. Where chapters, sections, or pages are referred to, the reference is to be deemed "inclusive" unless otherwise expressed.

- (c) The motion for admission must be made in open Court during term, and the applicant must be present in Court at the time.
- (d) No person shall be entitled by virtue of such admission to practise in New South Wales in any other capacity than that of a Barrister.
- (e) The Court must be satisfied that a New South Wales Barrister can be admitted as a Barrister of the Court in which such applicant has been admitted.

Every Solicitor, within one month after his admission, and thereafter in the month of October in every year, or at such other time as a Judge may in any case order, shall cause to be entered in the said Register (or to be filed with the Prothonotary, who shall cause it to be so entered forthwith) a memorandum, under his hand, of the address of his office, and if he does not practise in Sydney, or within one mile thereof, he shall add the name of his Sydney agent, who shall be a Solicitor practising in Sydney. 16. No process shall be issued by or in the name of any Solicitor whose office has not been so registered. No process to be issued by Solicitor in default. *Ibid.*, R. 24.

17. In like manner, whenever the Sydney agent of any Solicitor, or the office of any Solicitor, is changed, such Solicitor shall cause a memorandum of the name of his new agent, or of his new office to be entered in the said Register, or to be filed with the Prothonotary, who shall cause it to be so entered forthwith. Change of agent or address to be registered. *Ibid.*, R. 23.

Service, &c., 18. Where either party is represented by a Solicitor, all where party represented by Solicitor. Court are required or allowed to be delivered to or served upon such party shall be delivered to or served upon his Solicitor; and every matter or thing which by any such Rule or practice is required or allowed to be done by such party may be done by his Solicitor: Provided that this Rule shall not apply in any case where there is anything in the context or the nature of the case to show that the party himself was intended.

*Notice to Candidates for the Intermediate and Final Examinations in Law.*

1. The English text-books prescribed for these examinations are, in a great measure, prescribed for the purpose of indicating the scope and subject matter of the examination; but, on all subjects where the law in force in New South Wales differs from the English law, candidates are required to make themselves acquainted with the law in force in New South Wales. Text-books, or parts of books which require to be read in connection with local statutes, are marked with an asterisk.

2. Candidates are reminded that English statutes, passed after the 25th July, 1828, are not in force in this State, except in cases where the enactment has been made binding by the Imperial Parliament, either expressly or by necessary implication. At the same time, a considerable number of English statutes passed after that date (such as the English Wills Act, 1837), have been expressly adopted by the local legislature; whilst a considerable number of local enactments (such as the Bills of Exchange Act, 1887) have been based on similar enactments previously passed in the United Kingdom. As to how far law in force in England prior to 25th July, 1828, applies in New South Wales, reference may be made to Webb's "Imperial Law." As to how far English statutes have been adopted by, or embodied in, local legislation, reference may be made to Curlew's "Tables of Statutes."

3. In cases where local statutes are expressly prescribed as subjects for examination, the examination will be confined, so far as possible, to the general tenor and essential or more important provisions of the statutes referred to: or, in other words, to such matters as would find a place in a student's text-book. The English text-books will serve, to some extent, as a guide in this matter.

4. Candidates are reminded that the State laws on some of the subjects included in these examinations are liable to be superseded by Federal legislation; whilst on other subjects the existing Acts are likely to be displaced by Consolidated Acts. Candidates are further reminded that they are liable to be examined in any Acts or Rules relating to the subjects of these examinations passed or made by either the State or the Federal Parliament more than six calendar months prior to the date at which such examinations may be held.

5. Candidates are also advised, prior to entering on their studies for the final examination, to make themselves acquainted with the general tenor of both the Interpretation Act, 1897 (New South Wales), and the Acts Interpretation Act, 1901 (Commonwealth); whilst they are also reminded that the

interpretation of Imperial statutes, applicable in either State or Commonwealth, is governed by the Interpretation Act, 1889 (Imperial).

6. Where chapters, sections, or pages are referred to, the reference is to be deemed "inclusive," unless otherwise expressed.

#### *Intermediate Law Examinations*

will be held during each Term of 1905 upon the dates mentioned on page 141.

The subjects for examination, in accordance with Rule 445, will be as shown on page 159.

#### *Intermediate Legal History Examinations during 1905.*

EXAMINATIONS will be held by the Board on the 20th February, 8th May, 31st July, and 30th October.

The books appointed by the Judges for the Legal History Examination are shown on page 159.

Notice of intention to proceed to the Legal History Examination should be lodged with the Secretary of the Board at latest *before* the beginning of the Term during which the examination will be held. The notice should state the name of the candidate *in full*. The amount of the fees, £2 10s. 6d., should accompany the notice.

Articled Clerks will observe that on page 141 the dates upon which the Intermediate and Final Examinations will commence during 1905 are given, and also the *latest* dates upon which notice for such examinations may be lodged with the Secretary.

#### *Preliminary Examination for Articled Clerks.*

IN accordance with the regulations of the Supreme Court, candidates are required to pass an examination in the subjects of the Matriculation Examination.

Examinations are held at the University in the months of April and November, and the dates of such examinations are shown on page 141.

The authors set for the Examination in April, 1905, are the same as those prescribed for the Matriculation Examination in March, 1905.

For the Examinations in November, 1905, and April, 1906, the authors are the same as those set for the Matriculation Examination of March, 1906, and so on in future years.

The fees for this Examination (£5 10s. 6d.) are payable to the Secretary of the Solicitors' Admission Board, whose receipt must be forwarded to the Registrar of the University not less than seven days before the first day of examination.

Candidates for the Law Matriculation Examination will accordingly find it indispensable to acquaint themselves with the following information in reference to the ordinary Matriculation Examination.

Candidates for Matriculation are required to pass a satisfactory Examination in Latin, Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, and one of the following subjects:—Greek, French, German. Proficiency in writing English is also taken into account.

*Compulsory Subjects.*

1. LATIN.—Translation into English of passages from set authors and of Latin passages at sight, and translation of simple English sentences into Latin. Candidates are expected to show an accurate knowledge of Latin accidence.
2. ARITHMETIC.
3. ALGEBRA.—To quadratic equations involving one unknown quantity.
4. GEOMETRY.—Euclid, Books I, II, and III.
