REGULÆ GENERALES.

The following rules are hereby established, for the despatch of business in the Supreme Court, during the year 1913 :--

TERMS, HOLIDAYS, SITTINGS, AND VACATIONS.

1. The Terms, Holidays, Vacations, Circuits, and Sittings of the Court shall be those mentioned in the Law Almanac annexed hereto.

CROWN CASES RESERVED.

 Special Cases reserved on any Criminal Trial, when received by the Prothonotary, shall be set down for hearing on the next ensuing Friday on which the Court shall sit, unless a Judge shall otherwise order.

EQUITY.

3. The Chief Judge in Equity will sit for the hearing of Causes on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, at 11 o'clock; for the hearing of Motions and Petitions on Monday and Wednesday, from 10 to 11 o'clock; in Chambers, for Chamber applications, on Tuesday, from 10 to 11 o'clock; for Lunacy matters, on Thursday, from 10 to 11 o'clock; and for Motions, Petitions, adjourned Summonses, Decress on further directions, Motions for Decree, Demurrers, Special Cases, Short Causes, and other similar matters, on Friday, from 10 o'clock.

PROBATE, BANKRUPTOY, AND COMPANY MATTERS,

4. Applications for Probates and Letters of Administration and other non-contentious Probate matters will be taken by the Probate Judge on Monday at 10 o'clock, or at such other times as he shall appoint. All other Probate matters will be taken by the Probate Judge at such times as he shall appoint.

The Judge in Bankruptcy will, unless he shall otherwise appoint, take all Company matters on Tuesday at 10 o'clock, and the general bankruptcy business as follows:-Motions under Section 184 on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday; all other matters on Wednesday and Thursday, at 10 o'clock.

OHAMBER BUSINESS.

6. Chamber Business at Law will be taken on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, at 10 o'clock, except during the sittings for the trial of Causes and during Term, when the Chamber business will be taken at 9:30 a.m. : Provided that a summons may be returnable on any other day by order of a Judge.

SATURDAYS.

6. There will be no sitting of the Court in Sydney on any Saturday unless the Court or a Judge otherwise directs.

GENERAL RULES APPLICABLE TO EVERY YEAR.

PRECEDENCE OF BUSINESS.

495. Unless otherwise ordered, matters for hearing before the Full Court shall be taken in accordance with the following directions:

- (a) Any matter which, in the opinion of the Court, should be disposed of immediately, may be heard forthwith, or at such time as the Court appoints.
- (b) Criminal and other Crown cases will have precedence on Fridays.
- (c) Subject to the provisions of clause (a) hereof, Motions generally will have precedence on Mondays and Thursdays.

Subject to the preceding clauses, every matter in the Term paper will be heard in the order in which it is entered in the Term book.

CONFIRMATION OF ORDERS.

314. Notice must be given to the Prothonotary, on or before the Saturday preceding the commencement of each Term, of all intended applications for confirmation by the Court of orders made under and by virtue of Section 20 of the Act 1900, No. 35.

SETTING DOWN CAUSES AT LAW.

106. For each day of the Sittings for Causes there shall be separate Cause Lists, which shall be taken in the respective Jury Courts.

107. To the extent limited for each day as next mentioned, causes shall be set down consecutively only. No more than four causes shall be set down for any day for trial in Sydney by a Judge without a Jury, or by a Jury of four persons, nor more than one cause for trial by a Jury of twelve: Provided that an additional number of causes, not exceeding two, may be set down for any day, if the Prothonotary sees fit.

108. Until all Lists have been filled, in accordance with the last preceding Rule, no cause shall, except by leave of the Prothonotary, be set down in any List for any subsequent day.

JURIES OF TWELVE.

109. Provided that causes for trial by juries of twelve shall be set down for such days only as the Prothonotary shall in cach case direct.

TRANSFERRING CAUSES.

110. Causes, on the List of any Court, may be transferred to the List of any other, by order of a Judge, for trial on the day next but one following, or any later day : Provided that no such day shall be earlier than that for which the cause was first entered.

CAUSES ON CIRCUIT.

111. Causes for trial in any Circuit Court shall be entered for the day fixed in the Law Almanac for holding such Circuit Court. But whenever it appears to the Chief Justice, or to

the Judge intending to hold any Circuit Court, that it will not be convenient to hear the civil causes (if any) set down for trial at that Court on the day so fixed, the Chief Justice, or such Judge, may, not less than sixteen days before the day so fixed, appoint some other day for the trial of such tary shall thereupon forthwith give notice of such appointment to the solicitors in the said causes or to their town agents, and also to the Sheriff; and all notices already given between the parties shall hold good and be applied to the day so specially appointed, and all notices and subpenas to be therealter given or issued shall be given or issued for that day.

127. If no civil cause has been set down and notice of trial given and notified to the Prothonotary for any Circuit Court, up to the sixteenth day before the day named in the Law Almanac for the time being for the trial of civil causes thereat, no jury shall be summoned to such Court for the trial of civil issues without the leave of a Judge, and the Prothonotary shall give notice to the Sheriff accordingly.

POSTPONEMENT.

113. When any Sittings for causes are postponed, the date for the trial of any cause, specially fixed, shall also be postponed for the same number of days as that for which the Sittings have been postponed, unless a Judge shall otherwise order.

CAUSES UNCONCLUDED DURING THE SITTINGS.

145. Any cause, not concluded on the last day of the Sittings, may be continued on such day or days as the presiding Judge shall think fit.

REMANETS.

114. All causes remaining untried at any sittings shall be set down by the Prothonotary, each according to its appropriate list for the then next Sittings; and no new notice of trial, or to produce documents, shall be necessary. Every such cause shall have precedence over causes previously set down 4 for those Sittings.

APPLICATION FOR NEW TRIAL.

150. Every application for a nonsuit, or for a new trial, or in arrest of judgment, or for judgment non obstante veredicto, or for a venire de novo, or to enter a verdict, or to increase or reduce the amount of the verdict, shall be by notice of motion, and no rule nisi order to show cause or formal proceedings other than such notice of motion shall be made or taken. The moving party shall within eight days (or in causes tried at Circuit Courts within fourteen days) after the trial file a notice of appeal, together with all affidavits to be used in support of such motion. Provided that any such affidavits may, by leave of the Court or a Judge, be filed at a later date.

151. Every such notice of motion shall state the day or days on which the cause was tried, the verdict given or other termination of the trial, the motion intended to be made, and the grounds on which it will be made; and when the party had counsel at the trial shall be signed by one of such counsel.

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151a. A copy of every such notice of motion shall be left at the chambers of the Judge before whom the cause was tried on the day on which it is filed, and a copy thereof, and of any affidavit that may be filed in support thereof, shall on the day on which it is filed be served upon each opposing party or upon each solicitor on the record.

162. On or before the last day limited for filing such notice of motion, the moving party shall order a copy of the notes of the Judge before whom the cause was tried, and within eight days after receiving the same shall file a printed copy of such notes, and at the same time lodge three additional printed copies, and shall also within the same time serve four printed copies upon all parties upon whom a copy of the notice of appeal is required to be served. Provided that a Judge may on such conditions as he thinks fit extend the times for ordering filing, lodging, and serving copies of such notes, or may dispense with the printing or ordering of such notes.

154. Every such notice of motion shall be for the first day on which the Court sits in Banco after the expiration of sixteen days from the filing of such notice : Provided that no matter in which printed copies of the Judge's notes have to be filed and served shall be called on for hearing before such copies have been filed and served, or the time for so doing has expired, unless the Court or a Judge otherwise directs.

155. The moving party will be restricted upon the hearing to the grounds specified in the notice of motion.

157. The Associate of the Judge who tried the cause shall attend the Court on the hearing of the motion with the issues, exhibits, and other papers, and shall discharge thereafter the duties of the Prothonotary in respect of such motion until the same is disposed of.

PARTIES NOT READY TO PROCEED.

168. Where a notice of motion under Rule 150 hereof has been flied and no motion is made when the case is called on for hearing, the motion shall, unless the Court otherwise orders, be dismissed with costs.

STAY OF EXECUTION.

158*a*. Where any such notice of motion is filed it shall not operate as a stay of execution, except in cases where the Judge has reserved any point or given leave to move the Court in respect of any point.

VACATION BUSINESS.

9. During the Long Vacation, from the commencement thereof to the 31st January following, both days inclusive, except as in the next Rule provided, time shall not run in any jurisdiction of the Court, nor shall any business other than that specified in such Rule be taken without the leave of a Judge; but time shall run after the said 31st January, and throughout the Short Vacation.

10. During the Long Vacation, from the commencement thereof to the 31st January following, both days inclusive-

(a) In any action in which the Writ has been specially indorsed under the 24th section of the Common Law Procedure Act, 1899, all steps and proceedings may be taken and time shall run at Law.

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- (c) All Writs may be issued, executed, and returned.
- (d) Judgment may be signed in all cases in which the time which must expire before the same can be signed has expired before vacation begins.
- (e) Time shall run for putting in, excepting to and justifying bail.
- (f) Costs may be taxed in any case if the Taxing Officers deem it necessary.
- (g) All necessary proceedings may be taken for the purposes of an Appeal, or for obtaining or dissolving any injunction.
- (h) Summonses in cases of emergency may be returnable in Chambers on any Wednesday, or such other day as a Judge shall appoint.

Every notice of motion for a new trial must be filed within the time limited by these Rules notwithstanding Vacation.

CHAMBER BUSINESS.

310. Every Summons returnable in Chambers shall be served on the party whose attendances is required before one o'clock of the afternoon preceding the return day, or if returnable on Monday before one o'clock of the preceding Friday afternoon, unless a Judge otherwise orders.

836. No Chamber application will be entertained on any day in or out of Term, except in cases of emergency, after one o'clock.

In pursuance of all powers vested in us, or any of us, as members of the Barristers' Admission Board, or as Judges of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, we do order and direct as follows :---

Notice to Candidates for the Bar Examination under Appendix C.

1. The English text-books prescribed for this Examination are, in great measure, prescribed for the purpose of indicating the scope and subject matter of the examination ; but, on all subjects where the law in force in New South Wales differs from the English law, candidates are required to make them-selves acquainted with the law in force in New South Wales. Text-books or parts of text-books which require to be read in connection with the local statutes are marked with an asterisk.

2. Candidates are reminded that English Statutes passed after the 25th July, 1828, are not in force in this State, except in cases where the enactment has been made binding by the Imperial Parliament, either expressly or by necessary implica-At the same time, a considerable number of English tion. Statutes passed after that date (such as the English Wills Act, 1837), have been expressly adopted by the local Legislature : whilst a considerable number of other local enactments are based on similar enactments passed in the United Kingdom. As to how far law in force in England prior to the 25th July. 1828, applies in New South Wales, reference may be made to Webb's "Imperial Law." As to how far English Statutes have been adopted by, or embodied in, local legislation, reference may be made to Curlewis' "Table of Statutes."

 In cases where local Statutes are expressly prescribed as subjects for examination, the examination will be confined, so far as possible, to the general tenor and essential, or more important, provisions of the Statutes referred to: or, in other words, to such matters as would find a place in a student's text-book. The English text book will serve, to some extent, as a guide in this matter. Candidates may also obtain a few copies of previous papers, for the purpose of guidance, on applying to the Secretary to the Board.

4. Candidates are reminded that the State Laws on some of the subjects included in these examinations are liable to be superseded by Federal Legislation : whilst on other subjects the existing Acts are likely to be displaced by Consolidated Acts. Candidates are further reminded that they are liable to be examined in any Acts or Rules relating to the subjects of these examinations passed or made by either the State or the Federal Parliament more than six calendar months prior to the date at which such examinations may be held.

5. Where chapters, sections, or pages are referred to, the reference is to be deemed "inclusive" unless otherwise expressed.

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

Text-books, or parts of books which require to be read in connection with local statutes, are marked with an asterisk.

Candidates are reminded that English statutes, passed after the 25th July, 1823, are not in force in this State, except in cases where the enachment has been made binding by the Imperial Parliament, either expressly or by necessary implication. At the same time, a considerable number of English statutes passed after that date (such as the English Wills Act, 1337), have been expressly adopted by the local legislature; whilst a considerable number of local enactments have been based on similar enactments previously passed in the United Kingdom. As to how far law in force in English prior to 25th July, 1328, applies in New South Wales, reference may be made to Webb's "Imperial Law." As to how far English statutes have been adopted by, or embodied in, local legislation, reference may be made to Curlewis" "Tables of Statutes."

3. In cases where local statutes are expressly prescribed as subjects for examination, the examination will be confined, so far as possible, to the general tenor and essential or more important provisions of the statutes referred to : or, in other, words, to such matters as would find a place in a student's text-book. The English text-books will serve, to some extent, as a guide in this matter.

4. Candidates are reminded that the State laws on some of the subjects included in these examinations are liable to be superseded by Federal legislation; whilst on other subjects the existing Acts are likely to be displaced by Consolidated Acts. Candidates are further reminded that they are liable to be examined in any Acts or Rules relating to the subjects of these examinations passed or made by either the State or the Federal Parliament more than six calendar months prior to the date at which such examinations may be held.

Preliminary Examination for Articled Clerks.

In accordance with the regulations of the Supreme Court, candidates are required to pass an examination in the subjects of the Matriculation Examination.

Examinations are held at the University in the months of April and November, and the dates of such examinations are shown on page 187.

The authors set for the Examination in April, 1918, are the same as those prescribed for the Matriculation Examination in March, 1918.

For the Examinations in November, 1913, and April, 1914, the authors are the same as those set for the Matriculation Examination of March, 1914, and so on in future years.

Candidates for Matriculation are required to pass a satisfactory Examination in English, Latin, Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, and one of the following subjects:-Greek, French, or German. Proficiency in writing English is also taken into account.

Candidates for this Examination on or before the last days for giving notice to the Secretary, which days are stated on page 187, must notify the Secretary, either personally or by letter, of the subjects in which they desire to be examined,

and must also give their names in full, their addresses, and the place where they have been educated. The fee of £5 103. 0d, must also be paid at the same time. Until the fee is paid, and the requisite information given, no application forms will be sent to anyone.

Candidates who have passed any of the public examinations in the subjects which entitle them to a certificate of having passed the lower division of the ordinary Matriculation Examination, must, nevertheless, pay the fee of £5 10s. 8d. before they can be Articled.

 - (d) ALGEBRA.-Up to quadratic equations with two unknown quantities, ratio, proportion, surds, and simple questions in fractional and negative indices. Questions may be set involving the use of squared paper in simple equations and simplicancous equations.
 - (c) GEOMETRY.—Alternative questions will be given in Geometry. For one set, the subject of study will be the first three books of Euclid, and easy questions upon their subject-matter. Proofs other than Euclid's will be admitted, but no proof of any proposition will be accepted which assumes the proof of anything not contained in preceding propositions in Euclid. In the other set of questions, the regulations for the corresponding Geometry paper in the Junior Public-Examination will be adhered to.

Optional Subjects.

- (a) GREEK.—An Examination similar to that in Latin.
- (b) FRENCH.—The examination will comprise questions on accidence and syntax, and translation at sight from French into English and from English into French. Candidates will also be required to write a short letter or theme in French on some simple subject of which they may be all expected to have some knowledge. Candidates are recommended to read about 250 pages of modern French prose. No special books are prescribed, but © State O New South Wales through the Attomey General's Department

In the Supreme Court of New South Wales.

Matrimonial Causes Jurisdiction.

Friday, the tenth day of February, 1911.

It is hereby ordered that the following rules shall come into force as and from the date hereof :---

1. Rule 174 of the Rules of the 27th day of March, 1903, Rules 2 and 3 of the Rules of the 25th day of September, 1903, and the Rule of the 27th day of July, 1908, are hereby rescinded.

2. In all cases where personal service of any process, decree, order or other document requiring personal service cannot be promptly effected, application may be made by motion supported by affidavit to dispense with personal service or to substitute some other mode of service, and the Court may thereupon make such order as the circumstances of the case may require.

3. In all cases of personal service of any process, decree, order or other document, evidence of the identity of the person served with the person required to be served must be contained in the affidavit of service or in some further affidavit.

4. The affidavit containing such evidence of identity must in all cases of service of a Petition and Citation be filed before the issues are settled, unless the Judge otherwise orders.

5. Any application under section 14 of the District Courts (Amendment) Act, 1905, that any question of fact may be remitted by the Court to be tried in a District Court must be heard and determined fourteen days before the date fixed for holding the District Court to which it is proposed to have such question remitted.

6. Any such application for the trial of a question of fact before a District Court Judge without a jury may with the assent of such District Court Judge be heard and determined at a later time.

7. All orders made in interlocutory matters on motion or summons shall be drawn up passed and filed in the office of the Registrar within fourteen days after they shall have been made, or in default thereof shall, unless the Judge otherwise orders, be deemed to have lapsed.

In the Supreme Court of New South Wales.

Monday, the twenty-second day of May, A.D. 1911.

It is hereby ordered that the following Rules shall come into force from the date hereof :=

1. Either party may, by notice in writing, at any time not later than eight days before the day for which notice of trial or hearing shall be or has been given, call on the other party to admit, for the purposes of the cause, matter, or issue only, any specific fact or facts mentioned in such notice.

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And in case of refusal or neglect to admit the same within five days after service of such notice or within such further time as may be allowed by the Court or a Judge, the costs of proving such fact or facts shall be paid by the party so neglecting or refusing, whatever the result of the cause, matter, or issue may be, unless at the trial or hearing the Court or presiding Judge certifies that the refusal to admit was reasonable or unless the Court or a Judge at any time otherwise orders or directs.

2. Any admission made in pursuance of such notice is to be deemed to be made only for the purposes of the particular cause, matter, or issue, and not as an admission to be used against the party on any other occasion or in favour of any person other than the party giving the notice.

3. The Court or a Judge may at any time allow any party to amend or withdraw any admission so made on such terms as may be just.

In pursuance of all powers vested in us, or any of us, as members of the Barristers' Admission Board, or as Judges of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, we do order and direct as follows :—

Rule 3 of the Rules of the 1st December, 1906, is hereby amended by striking out the definition of "graduate" therein given, and by substituting therefor the following definition :--

"Graduate" means a person who has taken any degree granted after Examination in any University within the meaning of these Rules.

It is hereby ordered that the following rule shall come into force as and from the date hereof :--

Where any issues or questions of fact in a cause have been tried otherwise than before a Judge sitting in the Matrimonial Causes Jurisdiction and no motion for a decree has been made within one month after such trial, the Registrar shall place the cause in the list for the first convenient Motion day and shall notify all parties entitled to notice.

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RULES PROMULGATED DURING 1912.

The twenty-ninth day of February, 1912.

Is pursuance of the several powers vested in us in that behalf, we order and direct that from and after this date, Rule 300 of the "Consolidated Equity Rules of 1902" be rescinded, and in lieu thereof the following shall be Rule 300 ---

300. (1) (a) When money (other than a periodical payment as in part (c) of this Rule mentioned) is by a decree or order directed to be pail to a person who has an account at a bank in this Slate, the Master shall remit the same by post by registered letter, upon receiving a request to that effect in Form No. 15 in the Schedule to these Rules, and signed by such person and attested by a Justice of the Peace, a Commissioner for Affdavits, or a Notary Public. The order for such payment will be sent to the address stated in the request, and will not be negotiable.

(b) When money not exceeding £500 (other than a periodical payment in part (c) of this Rule mentioned) is by decree or order directed to be paid to a person residing in this State who has not an account at a bank in this State, the Master shall remit the same by post by registered letter to such person upon receiving a request to that effect in Form No. 16 in the Schedule to these Rules, and signed by such person and attested in the same manner required in the preceding part of this Rule (a). The order for payment will be sent to the address stated in the request, and will be crossed so as to be parable only through a bank.

(c) Any person residing within this State entitled under a decree or order to any interest, dividend, annuity, or other periodical payment, may send to the Minister a request in Form No. 17 in the Schedule to these Rules for the remittance of the same by post, from time to time, as it accrues due. Such request to be signed by such person and attested in the manner prescribed in the preceding parts of this Rule (a and b), and the Master may then afterwards, as such periodical payment falls due (and upon receiving a written request for each such payment, together with evidence of life or of the fulfilments of any conditions of payment as referred to in Rule 294) remit the same by post to the address stated in the request. The order for payment will be crossed to as to be papable only through a bank.

Provided that the Master may refuse to make a remittance under this Bule in any case in which he sees reason for so doing. And provided also that the transmission by post, upon a request of any crossed order for payment shall be at the sole risk of the person at whose request it is sent,

(2) The forms prescribed by this Rule may be altered by the Master with the approval of the State Treasurer. © State of New South Wales through the Attomy General's Department

Tuesday, the fifth day of March, 1912.

In pursuance of all powers vested in us we do order and direct as follows :---

Where in any civil or commercial matter pending before a Court or tribunal of a foreign country, a letter of request from such Court or tribunal for the service on any person in New South Wales of any process or citation in such matter, accompanied by a translation thereof in the English language, and by two copies of the process or citation to be served together with two copies thereof in the English language, is transmitted to the Suprome Court by the Attorney-General, with an intimation that it is desirable that effect should be given to such letter of request, the following procedure shall be adopted i—

(1.) Service of the process or citation shall be effected by the person wham a Judge of the Court may from time to time appoint for the purpose, or by the authorised agent of such person.

(2.) Such service shall be effected by delivering to the person to be served one copy of the process or citation, and one copy of the trauslation thereof, or in such other manner as may be directed by a Judge if he is satisfied that personal service cannot be effected.

(3.) After service has been effected, the process-server shall return to the Prothonotary the other copies of the process or citation and the translation thereof, together with an affidavit of service and particulars of his oharges for effecting same.

(4.) The authority of the person before whom such affidavit is sworn, to administer an oath, and his signature, shall be verified by a certificate of a Notary Public or of the Prothonotary.

(5.) The Prothonotary shall give a certificate of the amount which is properly payable for the cost of so effecting service.

(6.) The Prothonotary shall transmit to the Attorney-General the letter of request for service, the process or citation, of which service has been effected, and the translations thereof, together with the affidavit and certificates hereinbefore mentioned, and also a certificate under the seal of the Court in the form given i the Schedule hereto, with such variations as discunstances may require.

(7.) Upon the application of the Grown Solicitor, the Court or a Judge may make all such orders for substituted service or otherwise as may be necessary to give effect to these rules!

(8.) The duties of the Prothonotary under these rules may, in his absence, or during his indisposition, or at his request, be performed by the Chief Clerk of the Supreme Court.

The Prothonotary is hereby empowered to do all such things, and transact all such business, and exercise all such authority and jurisdiction in respect of the same as by virtue of any statute or custom, or by the rules and practice of the Court in its Common Law Jurisdiction are now done, transacted, or exercised by a Judge in Chambers, except in respect of the following proceedings and matters, that is to say :-

4. Applications for change of Venue.

5. Applications in respect of Pleadings.

15. Foreign Attachment.

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Providing that consent orders may be made in any case by the Prothonocary, excepting in respect of matters relating to the liberty of the subject or to Cirminal proceedings.

 The Prothonotary may refer any matter, which in his opinion should be so referred, to a Judge, who may dispose of the matter or give directions thereon.

3. Upon production of a certificate by the Prothonotary that he had refused to make an order in an ex parte matter, application may be made to a Judge for such order.

4. If either party is dissatisfied with the decision of the Prothonotary in any other matter, he may, within two days from such decision, or within such further time as may be allowed by a Judge, file a request that the matter be referred to the Judge sitting in Chambers, and shall, within the same time, serve a notice of such request having been filed.

5. The matter shall thereupon be placed in the list of matter for hearing on the then heat day on which a Judge shall sit for Chamber work.

6. A reference shall not operate as a stay of proceedings unless a Judge or the Prothonotary otherwise orders.

7. The costs of such reference shall be in the discretion of the Judge.

8. The scales of costs for business transacted before the Prothonotary shall be the same as are fixed for business transacted before the Judges.

9. In any case in which the Prothonotary is of opinion that the attendance of Counsel before him is necessary, he may give a certificate to that effect, and the taxing officer may act upon'such certificate.

10. The Court fees to be taken in respect of business transacted under these rules, before the Prothenotary shall be the same as those which are now taken in respect of the same business when transacted before a Judge.

11. The duties and powers of the Prothonotary under these rules may, in his absence or during his indisposition or at his request, be performed and exercised by the Deputy Prothonotary.


12. The gaoler at each gaol shall forward to the Prothonotary at the Supreme Court, Sydney, seven days before the days appointed for the regular sittings of the said Court in its Criminal Jurisdiction at Darlinghurst each year, a return in writing of all the persons detained in such gaol, otherwise than in pursuance of a sentence.

13. Such return shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto and shall be certified by the gaoler who transmits it.

14. Every such return shall be handed by the Prothonotary to the Associate of the Judge presiding at the sittings of the Central Criminal Court next ensuing, after such return has been forwarded. The Prothonotary shall also hand to such Associate a list of the gaolers, if any, who have failed to forward the prescribed return.
