REGULAE GENERALES.

THE following rules are hereby established for the despatch of business in the Supreme Court during the year 1949 :—

TERMS, SITTINGS, VACATIONS, ETC.

1. The Terms, Holidays, Vacations, Circuits, and Sittings of the Court shall be those mentioned in the Law Almanac annexed hereto.

COMMON LAW JURISDICTION.

2. Motions generally may be made on any Monday or Thursday during the sittings of the Full Court either in or out of Term, and on such other days as may be appointed.

Chamber business before a Judge or the Prothonotary will be taken on such days and at such times as may be appointed.

EQUITABLE JURISDICTION.

3. The Court will sit for the hearing of witness causes in Equity on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, at 10 a.m. Applications for interim injunction or for a receiver, or relating to the liberty of the subject, will be taken on any day at 10 a.m.

All other matters in Equity will be taken on Fridays at 10 a.m., and on other days by direction or leave of a Judge sitting in Equity.

COMPANY MATTERS.

Company matters will be taken on Monday mornings or at such other times as the Court shall direct.

LUNACY JURISDICTION.

4. Matters in Lunacy will be heard on Thursdays at 10 a.m.

PROBATE JURISDICTION.

5. Summonses and motions will be taken by the Probate Judge on Mondays at 10 a.m., or at such other times as he shall appoint. All other Probate matters will be taken by the Probate Judge at such times as he shall appoint.

MATRIMONIAL CAUSES JURISDICTION.

6. Causes will be heard at such times as may be directed by the Judge. Matters before the Registrar will be heard from Monday to Friday inclusive each week at 10-15 a.m., except during Vacation when matters will be taken on such days and such times as may be appointed.

SATURDAYS.

7. There will be no sittings of the Court in Sydney on any Saturday unless the Court or a Judge otherwise directs.

All rules in force as at 31st December, 1927, are to be found in the publication "Rules of the Supreme Court of New South Wales" (published in 1928).

BARRISTERS ADMISSION RULES.

Rules prior to 25th October, 1939, are incorporated in "The Supreme Court Practice" (3rd edition).

3. (20 November, 1942.—The following definition substituted for the definitions of "Graduate" and "University")—

"University graduate" means a person who has taken any degree in arts, or in law, or in medicine, granted after examination—

- (a) in the University of Sydney or of Oxford or of Cambridge; or
- (b) in any university granting degrees by virtue of any Imperial Act or Royal Charter, or any Colonial Act assented to by His Majesty or any of His Majesty's predecessors.

4. (19 November, 1941.—Substituted introductory words and new sub-clause (e))—

"The following persons only shall be eligible for admission as barristers, namely, British subjects who are":—

- (e) Barristers duly admitted to practise in the Supreme Court of New Zealand who have been in practice before that Court for not less than three years, and who satisfy the Board that they are qualified under the qualifications set out in Rule 38A (1) and comply with the requirements of Rule 38A (2).

10. (Substituted 20 November, 1942.)—The following persons only shall be eligible for admission as students-at-law:—

(a) University graduates as defined in Rule 3.

(b) Persons who have passed in a university an examination entitling them to matriculate in the University of Sydney or an examination which the Registrar of the University of Sydney certifies to be an equivalent examination, provided that in either case such Registrar certifies that such persons have passed an examination in Latin at the standard required for a pass in Latin at the lower standard at the matriculation examination at the University of Sydney and have also passed an examination in (i) Greek classics, or logic, or French language and literature, and (ii) mathematics.

(c) Persons who have matriculated in the University of Sydney and have passed two annual examinations therein.

(d) (Added 17 November, 1943.) Persons who have secured passes approved by the Board in examinations approved by the Board in the subjects mentioned in clauses (a), (b) and (c) of section 6 of the Legal Practitioners Act, 1898-1936.

Provided always that if the Board shall think fit so to do it may admit an otherwise qualified person as a student-at-law notwithstanding that he has not obtained an approved pass in an approved examination in one or more of the subjects mentioned in the said clauses (a), (b) and (c) conditionally upon his obtaining such a pass before he is admitted as a barrister.

12. (Substituted 19 November, 1941.)—

(1) Such notice shall be accompanied by certificates from two or more qualified persons.

(2) Every such certificate shall state (a) the name, address, and qualification of the person giving it, and (b) how long and in what circumstances he has known the applicant, and (c) shall state in his own handwriting whether in his opinion the applicant is a person of good fame and character.

(3) The following persons shall be qualified to give certificates for the purposes of this rule and of Rule 40, namely barristers, practising solicitors, stipendiary and police magistrates, professors and lecturers of universities, headmasters and ex-headmasters of schools registered under the Bursary Endowment Act, 1912, ministers of religion ordinarily officiating as such who have been registered for the celebration of marriages, and officers of police of or above the rank of inspector.

33. (22 November, 1939.)—Any person applying for admission as a barrister under subclause (b) of Rule 4 shall pay to the Secretary the sum of forty guineas, of which half shall be expended in aid of the Supreme Court Library and half in aid of the Library of the New South Wales Bar Association.

33A. (Added 19 November, 1941.)—Any person applying for admission as a barrister under subclause (e) of Rule 4 shall pay to the Secretary the sum of twenty guineas, of which half shall be expended in aid of the Supreme Court Library and half in aid of the Library of the New South Wales Bar Association.

36. (Added at end thereof 19 November, 1941.)—At the time of giving such notice every such person, with the exception of an applicant for admission under subclause (d) of Rule 4, shall lodge with the Secretary a statutory declaration that he is a British subject, annexing thereto a certified copy of his birth certificate or certificate of naturalization, or other evidence of his British nationality.

38. (Substituted 19 November, 1941.)—Every person so applying for admission under subclause (b) of Rule 4 shall produce to the Board a certificate of his admission and two statutory declarations by practising barristers of his own State that they are well acquainted with the applicant and that he is a person of good fame and character.

38A. (Added 19 November, 1941.)—

(1) Every person so applying for admission under subclause (e) of Rule 4 shall have the following qualifications, namely—

(i) The applicant must have been resident in New South Wales for at least five months preceding the date at which he intends to apply for admission in New South Wales.

(ii) The name of the applicant must not have been on the roll of solicitors in New Zealand during a period of at least one year preceding the date at which he intends to apply for admission in New South Wales.

(iii) The applicant must not during the said period of at least one year have practised in partnership or other association (except that of counsel briefed by a solicitor) with any person on the roll of solicitors in New Zealand.

(iv) The applicant must be a person of good fame and character.

(2) The requirements referred to in subclause (e) of Rule 4 are the following, namely—

(i) The applicant shall give to the Secretary at least two months prior to his making application for admission a written notice of his intention to make such application.

(ii) At the same time as he gives the notice aforesaid the applicant shall lodge with the Secretary the certificate of his admission as a barrister of the Supreme Court of New Zealand and a statutory declaration in Form No. 3 contained in the Second Schedule or to the like effect.

40. (Substituted 19 November, 1941.)—Every student-at-law so applying shall lodge with the Secretary a declaration in Form No. 2 contained in the Second Schedule, and also certificates as to character from two or more qualified persons as prescribed by Rule 12.

44. (Added at the end of present rule on 17 November, 1943.)—In any other case the Board may, in circumstances which it regards as sufficiently special, dispense with a literal compliance with these Rules.

46. (25 October, 1939.)—On application to the Board through the Secretary, the Board may, upon such conditions as it thinks fit, relax any of the Rules with respect to the admission and examination of students at-law in the case of any person who was or is engaged on active or other naval, military or air force service.

47. (Substituted 31 May, 1943.)—Where in connection with any war to which Great Britain is a party any British subject in the service of Great Britain her dominions or dependencies or her allies has been engaged abroad on active service or on duties connected with the war, or any British subject has been a prisoner of war or a civilian internee in an enemy country, and such person produces a certificate from the Council of Legal Education, or other body in Great Britain approved by the Board, that he has attended any of the lectures or has passed any of the examinations required or accepted by such Council or body from persons seeking admission as a Barrister or Advocate of the Superior Courts of Great Britain, or produces a certificate from the University of London or other University approved by the Board that he has passed an examination in law conducted by that University such as would be accepted by that University for the purpose of its degree in law if such person were a candidate for such degree, and satisfies the Board that he passed such examination before his return from abroad, the Board may reduce, to such an extent as it thinks fit, the period of studentship-at-law required under these Rules, and may exempt him from examination in any subject if, in its opinion, he has in manner aforesaid passed a substantially equivalent examination.

CHILD WELFARE RULES.

Rules made under the Child Welfare Act, 1939, were published in the Government Gazette No. 105 of 2nd August, 1940.

Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of October, 1942.

IN pursuance of the powers given to us by the Child Welfare Act, 1939, as amended by the Child Welfare (Amendment) Act, 1941, or otherwise vested in us, we do order and direct as follows:—

The Child Welfare Rules, 1940, are hereby amended by the rescission of Rule 11 and the insertion in its stead of the following new Rule 11.

11. (1) Prior to the time at which any application for an order of adoption is to be dealt with, the applicant shall lodge in the Equity Office two engrossments, and in the case of a child born in any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia or in any territory of the Commonwealth of Australia three engrossments, upon paper of brief size of the order applied for in accordance with Form No. 9 or Form No. 10 to these rules whichever shall be appropriate, and upon the making of the order the Judge shall sign one of such engrossments with such amendments (if any) as he shall think necessary, and such engrossment so signed shall, subject to the payment of the proper fee thereon (if any) constitute the order of the Court upon the application and in the same way and to the same extent as if the order had been settled, passed and entered in accordance with the present practice of the Court. Upon the signature of the order, the applicant shall complete the second of the said engrossments so that the same shall be a copy of the order as signed by the Judge and shall thereupon file such copy in the Equity Office.

(2) In all cases in which the order of adoption is made in respect of a child born in any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia or in any territory of the Commonwealth of Australia and where the Minister has made arrangements with the Minister administering any law relating to the adoption of children in such other State or territory (hereinafter called "the corresponding Minister") pursuant to section

172A (1) of the Child Welfare Act, 1939, as amended by the Child Welfare (Amendment) Act, 1941, the Deputy Registrar or Chief Clerk in Equity shall complete the third of the said engrossments so that the same shall be a copy of the order as signed by the Judge and shall endorse thereon his Certificate that the same is correct and shall forthwith transmit the said third engrossment so completed and certified as aforesaid to the Minister for transmission to the corresponding Minister.

15. (Substituted 28th July, 1948).—The Registrar-General shall register any such Memorandum for Registration so approved as aforesaid upon receipt thereof, in a separate register to be styled "The Register of Orders of Adoption," and shall supply to any person requiring the same a copy of such memorandum upon payment of the sum of five shillings.

COMMON LAW AND GENERAL RULES.

Rules prior to 31st July, 1939, are incorporated in "The Supreme Court Practice" (3rd edition).

14. (Substituted 12 March, 1943).—No Solicitor shall practise as such until he shall have caused to be registered with the Incorporated Law Institute of New South Wales the address for the time being of his office, and if he does not practise in the City of Sydney the name of his Sydney Agent, who shall be a Solicitor practising in the City of Sydney.

15. (Substituted 12 March, 1943).—A Solicitor shall comply with Rule 14 by including in his application for a practising certificate particulars of his office address and, where necessary, the name of his Sydney agent, and by notifying the Secretary of the said Institute in writing of any change in such particulars within one month of such change. Such registration shall be effective only during the currency of his practising certificate.

16. (Substituted 12 March, 1943).—Any Solicitor may, in addition to his Registered Office, have a Branch Office or Offices, provided that he or some other Solicitor entitled to practise in New South Wales, is in charge of each such Branch Office and attends there upon each day on which such office is open.

17. (Substituted 12 March, 1943).—If any Solicitor of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, resident in an adjoining State shall have an Office in New South Wales, he, or some other Solicitor entitled to practise in New South Wales, shall be in charge of such office, and attend there regularly during the hours such office is open.

22. (Substituted 16 February, 1944).—A solicitor or certificated conveyancer who has not practised for two years continuously shall not commence nor resume the practice of his profession without first obtaining an order from the Court: Provided that the period of war service as defined by the Legal Practitioners (War Service) Amendment Act, 1940, of a solicitor soldier within the meaning of that Act shall not count in the computation of the period of two years mentioned in this rule. Any person acting in contravention of this rule may be struck off the roll of solicitors or certificated conveyancers as the case may be.

27D. (1) (Substituted 31 October, 1941).—Where a solicitor or conveyancer in the course of his practice becomes aware of facts or circumstances which give rise in his mind to a reasonable suspicion that the trust funds of some other solicitor or conveyancer (not being his client)

are not in order, it shall be his duty to put the facts upon affidavit entitled in the matter of the Legal Practitioners Act, 1898-1936, and of this rule, and in the matter of the solicitor or conveyancer in question. Such affidavit shall be filed (without fee) in the office of the Prothonotary, and at the same time two copies of the affidavit shall be lodged with the Prothonotary.

(2) The Prothonotary, upon receipt of the copies of such affidavits may either bring the matter before the Court forthwith or forward the copies of such affidavit to the Council of the Incorporated Law Institute for such inquiry and action, if any, as it shall deem fit. If the Council considers that the case calls for inquiry, it shall call upon the solicitor or conveyancer whose trust funds are in question for an explanation of the matter, and may also call upon him within a time named by it to produce for inspection, as it may require, any books, papers, or documents it considers necessary for the purpose of elucidating the matter in question, and of showing the condition of his trust account.

27E. (Added 17 November, 1943).—No Solicitor shall expressly or impliedly represent that any person who is not in fact in partnership with him is his partner, and no Solicitor who is not in fact in partnership with another Solicitor shall hold himself out or allow himself to be held out as being his partner.

29 (4). (Substituted 8 November, 1948).—The Commissioner who issues such writ shall (except in the Criminal Jurisdiction of the Court) charge such fees as are prescribed in the Second Schedule to these rules.

161. (Substituted 15 November, 1948).—

(1) Unless otherwise ordered by a Judge, every exhibit put in evidence in any cause or matter in the Common Law or Matrimonial Causes Jurisdictions of the Court shall be delivered by the associate to the Prothonotary or the Registrar who shall direct the manner of its disposal. No court fee shall be charged in respect of such direction.

(2) Where an exhibit has been produced from the custody of the party to the cause or matter who tendered it, it shall be returned to such party or his solicitor, but where it has been produced from the custody of the other party or by a person not a party to the cause or matter, the Prothonotary or Registrar may direct that the exhibit be returned to such other party or person.

(3) Unless a Judge otherwise orders, any exhibit being a record or document of a Government Department may be returned upon request to the Department by the Prothonotary or Registrar prior to the cause or matter in respect of which it was put in evidence being finally disposed of upon an undertaking being given by the appropriate officer of the Department to return it to the Court whenever called upon.

302A. (29 July, 1948).—In every application to the Court or a Judge, where no other relevant provision is applicable, the following Rules shall be observed by each party with respect to all affidavits filed or served on behalf of that party in the matter of the application—

- (a) The pages of the first affidavit shall be numbered progressively in figures from 1 onwards.
- (b) Any succeeding affidavits shall be filed and served in chronological order according to the dates of filing.
- (c) The pages of each succeeding affidavit, after the first, shall be numbered progressively in figures carrying on from the last figure of the immediately preceding affidavit.

(d) The originals and any copies filed in Court shall be fastened together in chronological order, so that each set shall have a continuous numerical pagination.

897. (29 November, 1939).—

(1) Subject to subclause (2) hereof, when a defendant has not entered an appearance no further documents need be served upon him except for the purpose of attachment, unless a judge or the Prothonotary otherwise orders.

(2) Where the plaintiff has signed judgment by default under section 28 (1) of the Common Law Procedure Act, 1899, and has set the action down for the assessment of damages he shall give to the defendant notice of trial in accordance with Rule 118, unless a judge or the Prothonotary otherwise orders and such notice of trial shall be in the form hereunder and shall be served in the manner to be directed by a judge or the Prothonotary.

A defendant so served with notice of trial who desires to be heard as to damages, shall for that purpose either appoint a solicitor and file notice of such appointment with the Prothonotary or if he intends to appear in person register with the Prothonotary an address for service within two miles of the General Post Office, Sydney, and shall in either case serve notice thereof upon the plaintiff within such time after service as may be directed.

401. (28 July, 1948).—Christmas Day and the three following days, and the days between Thursday next before and the Wednesday next after Easter day, and also any Saturday shall not be reckoned or included in any rules, notices or other proceedings, except notices of trial.

406. (Substituted 29 April, 1942).—Upon the trial or hearing of any cause, suit or matter the Associate shall enter in the Associate's Court Book the following :—

- (1) Name and number of the suit.
- (2) Appearances.
- (3) Jury.

- (4) Times of addresses, hearings, adjournments, summings-up.
- (5) Witnesses and exhibits.
- (6) Verdict or result of trial.
- (7) Whether two or more cases heard together.
- (8) Any direction made or given by the Court, as to costs or otherwise.
- (9) A receipt for exhibits and documents handed out pursuant to an order of the Court or Judge at the trial.

407. (Rescinded 29 April, 1942.).

407A. (Substituted 13 November, 1946)—

(1) No Court fees (except fees in respect of the copying of documents) shall be charged in any case in which such fees, if charged, would have to be paid by any Government Department or Body whose expenditure is directly met from the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

(2) Notwithstanding the preceding sub-rule such Government Department or Body shall be entitled to charge such Court fees and include them in any costs which it may be entitled to recover from any person.

(3) (Added 19 February, 1948)—No court fees shall be charged for the issue of a writ of *dedimus potestatem* if the Prothonotary is satisfied that the taking of the oaths before a Judge within the prescribed time would involve serious inconvenience to the party required to take such oaths.

507. (8th June, 1945). Rule 507 of the 11th May, 1938 amended by inserting next after the word "exhibits" "The exhibits shall be arranged in a single chronological order irrespective of the order in which they were put in evidence on behalf of the respective parties."

525. (Substituted 28 February, 1944.)—Applications for discovery of documents shall be made not later than the expiration of twenty-eight days after final joinder of issue, provided that an order for discovery may be made upon an application made at a later stage if special circumstances are shown to the satisfaction of the Court or a judge.

527. (25 May, 1944.)—Appeals from a Court of Marine Inquiry established under the Navigation Act, 1912-1942, shall unless otherwise ordered be heard by a Judge of the Supreme Court assisted by two assessors.

(2) Within fourteen days of the filing of the notice of appeal, or within such time as may be ordered by a Judge of the Supreme Court, the appellant shall file one and lodge three copies of the appeal book containing a record of the proceedings before the Court of Marine Inquiry, including the evidence, the exhibits, the findings and the reasons of the Court, and shall within the time specified serve four copies of the appeal book upon the Registrar of the Court of Marine Inquiry and two copies thereof upon any other interested party to the appeal. The appeal books may be duplicated by the roneo or other approved duplicating process unless otherwise ordered by a Judge of the Supreme Court.

(3) Any party interested in the appeal may apply on summons supported by affidavit to a Judge of the Supreme Court for directions.

528. (9th August, 1946.) (1) In these Rules, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires or indicates :—

"The Act" means the Liquor (Amendment) Act, 1946.

The word "party" includes the Electoral Commissioner and any other person allowed by the Court to be represented upon the hearing of any reference.

(2) The Prothonotary shall forthwith after receipt of a statement of a question referred to the Court under the Act cause a copy thereof to be published in the Government Gazette.

(3) The Prothonotary shall, within seven days after receipt of such statement, notify the Electoral Commissioner and any other person who, in the opinion of the President of the Legislative Council, or of the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, ought to be so notified.

(4) Such notification may be sent by post by prepaid registered letter addressed to any such person at his last known place of abode. Publication in the Gazette as aforesaid shall be deemed good service upon all persons whose place of abode is unknown.

(5) Any person to whom notification has to be given or any other person who has been allowed to appear may, within fourteen days after the publication in the Government Gazette, or by leave of the Court or a Judge, at any later time enter an appearance to the proceedings.

(6) Every appearance shall give an address within two miles of the General Post Office, Sydney, where all documents for the person appearing may be left for him.

(7) The Court may order any party to a proceeding to give particulars or further and better particulars in respect of any allegation made by him.

(8) At least seven days' notice of the time appointed for the hearing and determination of any question so referred as aforesaid shall be given to every party who has entered an appearance or to any person whom the Court directs to be notified.

(9) The Court shall in all cases have full discretionary power to receive further evidence upon questions of fact, such evidence to be either by oral examination in Court, by affidavit, or by deposition taken before a Commissioner.

(10) Non-compliance with any of these Rules shall not render any proceeding void unless the Court so directs, but such proceedings may be set aside either wholly or in part as irregular or amended or otherwise dealt with in such manner and upon such terms (if any) as appear to be just.

(11) Any enlargement of time may be ordered, although the application for the same is not made until after the expiration of the time allowed.

CONVEYANCING ACT, 1919-1943.

General Order.

A general order relating to conveyancing costs was promulgated on 15th January, 1945 and published in the Government Gazette of 19th January, 1945. It is also published in Conveyancing Costs by C. A. Bailey (Sixth Edn.)

COSTS RULES.

50. (Substituted 24th July, 1946) (1) The following principles shall be applied in the taxation of costs :—

- (a) On every taxation the taxing officer shall allow all such costs, charges and expenses as appear to him to have been necessary or proper for the attainment of justice or for defending the rights of any party.
- (b) Save upon taxation to ascertain the costs payable to a solicitor by his client, no costs shall be allowed which appear to the taxing officer to have been incurred or increased through negligence or mistake or through overcaution, or by the payment of special fees to counsel, or of special charges or expenses to witnesses or other persons or by other unusual expenses; but upon such a taxation such costs, unless due to the solicitor's default, may be allowed against the client if authorised by him after the solicitor has warned him that they go, or may be held to go, beyond the necessities of the occasion, and also, if the client may expect to recover his costs from another party or a fund, that the costs in question will not, or may not, be allowed to him against the other party or fund.

(2) Provisions in statutes, rules, judgments or orders that costs are to be taxed as between party and party, or as between solicitor and client, shall not of themselves be deemed to prevent the application of these principles.

84. (Substituted 26 September, 1944.)—(1) (a) Except for business done or performed during the period from the fourteenth day of September, 1931, to the fourth day of December, 1937, inclusive, for which an increase of 10 per cent. only shall be added, the charges to be made by and allowed to solicitors in respect of all business done or performed since the thirteenth day of March, 1920, until and including the thirtieth day of September, 1944, shall be increased by 20 per cent. whether the bill of costs for such work is taxed or not.

(b) The charges to be made by and allowed to solicitors in respect of all business done or performed on and from the first day of October, 1944, shall be increased by 33½ per cent. instead of 20 per cent. whether the bill of costs for such work is taxed or not.

(2) The appropriate percentage shall be calculated upon the total amount of their professional charges for business done or performed during the appropriate period, as distinct from disbursements, appearing in any bill of costs delivered to a client, or on behalf of a client served upon another party.

(3) Such increases shall be allowed upon any taxation of costs in respect of any such business whether the taxation proceeds between party and party, as between solicitor and client, or between solicitor and client.

(4) This Rule shall not apply to the assessment of any gross sum under Rule 59 of these Rules, and shall not affect the question whether one-sixth has been taxed off a bill of costs.

(5) (Added 28 September, 1944.)—The general increases provided for in this Rule shall not apply in the Probate Jurisdiction in respect of the fixed scale of charges to be allowed to solicitors in connection with the obtaining grants of probate or letters of administration where no contention has arisen.

CRIMINAL APPEAL RULES.

(Tuesday, the 12th day of March, 1940.)

It is hereby ordered that Rule 4A, which was added on the 15th September, 1925, to the rules made under the Criminal Appeal Act, 1912, be and the same is hereby rescinded.

DENTAL BOARD APPEAL RULES, 1940.

(Wednesday, 20th March, 1940.)

1. In these rules the following words have the several meanings hereby assigned to them, unless there is something in the subject matter or context repugnant to such construction, viz.—

"The Court" means three or more Judges of the Supreme Court sitting in Banco.

"A Judge" means a Judge of the Supreme Court sitting in Court or in Chambers.

"The Board" means the Dental Board constituted under the provisions of the Dentists Act, 1934.

"The Registrar" means the registrar appointed or deemed to be appointed under the Dentists Act, 1934.

"Person" includes a body politic or corporate.

"Party" includes any person served with notice of or attending any proceeding.

"Affidavit" or "oath" includes affirmation, statutory declaration, and the declaration in lieu of oath under the Oaths Act, 1900; and the word "sworn" includes affirmed and declared.

"In writing" or "written" includes printing, lithography and other modes of representing words in a visible form.

"The appellant" means the person who has appealed to the Supreme Court from a decision or order of the Board.

Words importing the singular number include the plural number, and words importing the plural number include the singular number. Words importing the masculine gender include females.

2. Every appeal to the Court shall be brought by notice of appeal.

3. (a) Where any person desires to appeal to the Court against the decision of the Board pursuant to section 8 (9) he shall file in the Prothonotary's Office in the Supreme Court within 3 months after the date on which notice is given him by the Registrar that his name has been removed from the register or his registration suspended, or within 6 months after the date on which he applied to be registered, as the case may be, a notice of appeal setting forth the grounds and reasons for such appeal, which notice shall be in a form similar to the form in the Schedule to these rules.

(b) Any notice of appeal may be amended at any time as to the Court may seem fit.

4. A copy of the notice of appeal shall in every case be served upon the Board and on the person preferring a complaint or charge under section 8. For the purposes of these rules, service upon the Registrar shall be deemed to be service upon the Board. Such service shall be effected, unless a Judge otherwise orders or allows further time, within 14 days next after the filing of the said notice of appeal.

5. (a) The appellant, unless a Judge otherwise orders or allows further time, shall within 14 days after the filing of the notice of appeal, file and lodge in the Prothonotary's Office three printed or roneoed copies of the appeal book comprising the notice of appeal, the evidence, the exhibits, the order or decision appealed from, and any reasons given for the same, and shall, within the like time, also serve four such copies upon the Board and one such copy upon the person preferring the complaint or charge.

(b) Such printed copies shall be printed upon cream white foolscap folio paper in 11-point type, No. 12 point body, length of type line including numerical side note five inches, sixty lines to a page, numerals every ten lines, with an inner margin an inch wide and an outer margin two and a quarter inches wide.

(c) Such roneoed copies shall be roneoed upon one side of cream white foolscap paper, double spaced lines, with an inner margin an inch wide and an outer margin two and a quarter inches wide, every fifth line to be numbered in the outer margin.

6. On such copies being filed and lodged and an affidavit of the service thereof being filed in the Prothonotary's Office, the appeal shall be set down for hearing.

7. In every case in which service of any document shall be directed by these rules, such service shall, unless otherwise provided, or unless a Judge shall otherwise order, be effected by serving the same personally upon the person required to be served.

8. (a) The Court shall in all cases have full discretionary power to receive further evidence upon questions of fact, such evidence to be either by oral examination in Court, by affidavit or by deposition taken before a Commissioner.

(b) Such further evidence may be given without special leave in any case as to matters which have occurred after the date of the order or decision from which the appeal is brought; in all other cases such further evidence shall be admitted on special grounds only, and not without special leave.

9. On the hearing of every such appeal, each party may respectively appear either in person or by solicitor or counsel. Where the Board appears in person, such appearance shall be by the member presiding at the meeting at which was made the decision or order against which the appeal is brought.

10. The Court shall have power to make such order as to the whole or any part of the costs of the appeal and of the hearing by the Board as to the Court may seem just, and to assess the whole or any part of such costs either with or without the consent of any party; but no order shall be made for the payment of any costs by the Board to any other party unless the Court shall be of opinion that the Board was, in the matter in question, actuated by malicious or improper motives.

11. All interlocutory applications shall be made to a Judge in Chambers on summons or motion supported by affidavit, and may be made *ex parte* unless such Judge shall otherwise order. Orders made by a Judge in Chambers shall be signed by him personally. The costs of every such application shall be in the discretion of the Judge, who shall have power to make such order as to the whole or any part thereof as to him may seem just, and to assess the whole or any part of such costs, either with or without the consent of any party: Provided that no order shall be made by the Judge for the payment by the Board to any other party of any costs of any interlocutory proceeding unless the Judge shall be of opinion that the Board was, in the matter in question, actuated by malicious or improper motives.

12. In every case in which any costs are ordered to be paid by one party to another party, such costs, unless assessed as aforesaid, shall be taxed and certified by the Prothonotary: Provided that the Court or a Judge or the Prothonotary shall have power to appoint such other officer as the Court or such Judge or the Prothonotary shall think fit to tax and certify the same.

13. All summonses, notices of motion, affidavits and other documents (other than exhibits) used or intended to be used on any application to the Court or a Judge shall be intituled in the same manner as the notice of appeal.

14. The decrees and orders of the Court shall be signed by the Prothonotary and be under the appropriate office seal and forwarded to the Registrar.

15. The Court fees to be demanded and paid in respect of proceedings and matters under these rules shall be the same as those demanded from and paid by parties in similar matters in the Supreme Court.

16. Non-compliance with any of these rules shall not render any proceedings void unless the Court or a Judge so directs, but such proceedings may be set aside, either wholly or in part, as irregular, or amended or otherwise dealt with, in such manner and upon such terms (if any) as appear to be just.

NOTE.—The rules promulgated under the Matrimonial Causes Act, 1899 (with amendments to 1st December, 1946) and the rules promulgated on 7th March, 1946, under the Matrimonial Causes Act, 1945 (Federal), are incorporated in Mackenzie's "Practice in Divorce" (5th edition), and Supplement thereto published in March, 1946.

Tuesday, the twenty-fourth day of February, 1948.

It is hereby ordered that as on and from the first day of April, 1948, Rules 79 to 84 inclusive of the Matrimonial Causes Rules of the 10th June, 1935, as amended, shall be rescinded and the following Rules substituted therefor. Notwithstanding the said rescission, the said Rules of 10th June, 1935, as amended, shall continue to be applicable to all appeals and applications for new trial commenced before the 1st day of April, 1948, and the Rules hereby substituted shall be applicable only to appeals and applications for new trial commenced on or after the said 1st day of April, 1948 :—

APPEALS.

79. An appeal pursuant to section 82 of the Act, and an application for a new trial pursuant to section 84 of the Act (both of which are herein referred to as appeals), shall be entered or made, and proceeded with, in the manner following.

80. Within twenty-one days next after the making of the decree or order the appellant or applicant (both of whom are herein referred to as the appellant) shall file in the Court a notice of motion stating the nature of the relief sought and the grounds upon which it is sought, and serve a copy thereof on the other party or parties thereto or his, her or their solicitor.

81. Whatever the nature of the relief sought, the Court which hears the motion may allow or dismiss it, affirm, set aside, or vary the decree or order or any part of it, or direct a new trial of the suit or any part of it, or make such other decree or order as in the circumstances seem to the Court desirable for the proper administration of justice.

82. A copy of every such notice of motion, whether to the Full Court or to the High Court of Australia, shall be left at the chambers of the judge before whom the matter was heard within the time prescribed for serving the notice of motion upon the other party or parties thereto.

83. (1) Within twenty-one days after the filing in Court of the notice of motion the appellant shall give such security and in such manner as the judge or registrar shall direct: Provided that no security shall be required in appeals on the question of costs only.

(2) If security be given within the prescribed time, and in any case in which security is not required, the appellant shall at the time of filing the appeal book produce to the registrar or such other officer delegated by him the notes of evidence and judgment or summing-up, checked and initialled by the associate.

84. In all cases when it is necessary to read the evidence given at the hearing or trial the appellant shall within fourteen days after the filing of the notice of motion, unless a judge shall otherwise order or allow further time, file with the registrar four printed copies of the issues and evidence, and shall within the like time also serve a like number of such printed copies on the other party or parties thereto or his, her or their solicitor: Provided that in appeals from orders made on interlocutory applications when the evidence appears wholly by affidavit, it shall not be necessary to file or serve such printed copies, but the appellant shall file, within the time prescribed, two additional copies of each affidavit. Copies of the documentary exhibits, arranged as far as possible in a single chronological order irrespectively of the order in which they were put in evidence, shall be included in the copies filed and served: Provided that, by agreement between the parties or by order of the Court or a judge, such exhibits as are unnecessary for the purposes of the appeal may be omitted.

84A. All documents of which printed copies are by any rule required to be filed shall be printed upon cream white foolscap folio paper in 11-point type, No. 12-point body, length of type line, including numerical side note, 5 inches, sixty lines to a page, numerals every ten lines, with an inner margin an inch wide and outer margin 2 inches and a quarter wide.

84B. Save as herein or in the Act provided, appeals to the Full Court shall be subject to the common law rules for the time being in force in relation to motions for new trials.

84C. All appeals shall be set down within the first fourteen days of the term next following the decree, order or verdict the subject of the appeal, for such day as the Court may appoint for the hearing of appeals in matrimonial causes: Provided that if no security be given, as required by these Rules, when security is necessary, the registrar shall not set down such appeal, and the same shall be deemed to have lapsed.

MEDICAL BOARD APPEAL RULES.

Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of May, 1939.

1. In these rules the following words have the several meanings hereby assigned to them, unless there is something in the subject matter or context repugnant to such construction, viz.

"The Court" means three or more Judges of the Supreme Court sitting in Banco.

"A Judge" means a Judge of the Supreme Court sitting in Court or in Chambers.

"The board" means the New South Wales Medical Board appointed under the provisions of the Medical Practitioners Act, 1938.

"The disciplinary tribunal" means the disciplinary tribunal constituted under the Medical Practitioners Act, 1938.

"Order of the Board" includes removal under section 25 by the board from the register of any name or particulars and any amendment under section 25 of the register; and shall also include any refusal by the board of the restoration of any name to the register, or any refusal by it to grant a license under section 30 (4).

"The Secretary" means the secretary to the board appointed under the Medical Practitioners Act, 1938.

"Person" includes a body politic or corporate.

"Party" includes any person served with notice of or attending any proceeding.

"Affidavit" or "oath" includes affirmation, statutory declaration, and the declaration in lieu of oath under the Oaths Act, 1900; and the word "sworn" includes affirmed and declared.

"In writing" or "written" includes printing, lithography and other modes of representing words in a visible form.

"The appellant" means the person who has appealed to the Supreme Court from a decision or order of the board or of the disciplinary tribunal; and includes an applicant under section 25 (4).

Words importing the singular number include the plural number, and words importing the plural number include the singular number.

Words importing the masculine gender include females.

2. Every appeal to the Court shall be brought by notice of appeal.

3. (a) Where any person desires to appeal to the Court against the decision or order of the board or of the disciplinary tribunal pursuant to sections 19, 25(4), 28(3), 29(4) or 30(4) he shall, within 21 days next after the date of the decision or order of the board, or the notification by the disciplinary tribunal, to the registered person, of the making of its order or within such extended time as the board may allow, file in the Prothonotary's Office in the Supreme Court a notice of appeal setting forth the grounds and reasons of and for such appeal, which notice shall be in a form similar to the form in the Schedule to these rules.

(b) Any notice of appeal may be amended at any time as to the Court may seem fit.

4. A copy of the notice of appeal shall in every case be served upon the board and on the person preferring a complaint or charge under section 27. For the purposes of these rules, service upon the Secretary shall be deemed to be service upon the board. Such service shall be effected, unless a Judge otherwise orders or allows further time, within 14 days next after the filing of the said notice of appeal.

5. (a) The appellant, unless a Judge otherwise orders or allows further time, shall within 14 days after the filing of the notice of appeal file and, lodge in the Prothonotary's Office three printed or roneoed copies of the appeal book comprising the notice of appeal, the evidence, the exhibits, the order or decision appealed from, and any reasons given for the same, and shall, within the like time, also serve four such copies upon the board and one such copy upon the person preferring the complaint or charge.

(b) Such printed copies shall be printed upon cream white foolscap folio paper in 11 point type, No. 12 point body, length of type line including numerical side note five inches, sixty lines to a page, numerals every ten lines, with an inner margin an inch wide and outer margin two inches and a quarter wide.

(c) Such roneoed copies shall be roneoed upon one side of cream white foolscap paper, double spaced lines, with an inner margin an inch wide and an outer margin two and a quarter inches wide, every fifth line to be numbered in the outer margin.

6. On such copies being filed and lodged and an affidavit of the service thereof being filed in the Prothonotary's Office, the appeal shall be set down for hearing.

7. In every case in which service of any document shall be directed by these rules, such service shall, unless otherwise provided, or unless a Judge shall otherwise order, be effected by serving the same personally upon the person required to be served.

8. (a) The Court shall in all cases have full discretionary power to receive further evidence upon questions of fact, such evidence to be either by oral examination in Court, by affidavit or by deposition taken before a Commissioner.

(b) Such further evidence may be given without special leave in any case as to matters which have occurred after the date of the order or decision from which the appeal is brought; in all other cases such further evidence shall be admitted on special grounds only, and not without special leave.

9. On the hearing of every such appeal, each party may respectively appear either in person or by solicitor or counsel. Where the board appears in person, such appearance shall be by the member presiding at the meeting at which was made the decision or order against which the appeal is brought.

10. The Court shall have power to make such order as to the whole or any part of the costs of the appeal and of the hearing by the Board or disciplinary tribunal as to the Court may seem just, and to assess the whole or any part of such costs either with or without the consent of any party; but no order shall be made for the payment of any costs by the board to any other party unless the Court shall be of opinion that the board was in the matter in question actuated by malicious or improper motives.

11. All interlocutory applications shall be made to a Judge in Chambers on summons or motion supported by affidavit, and may be made ex parte unless such Judge shall otherwise order. Orders made by a Judge in Chambers shall be signed by him personally. The costs of every such application shall be in the discretion of such Judge, who shall have power to make such order as to the whole or any part of such costs as to him

may seem just, and to assess the whole or any part of such costs, either with or without the consent of any party : Provided that no order shall be made by such Judge for the payment by the board to any other party of any costs of any such interlocutory proceeding unless such Judge shall be of opinion that the board was, in the matter in question, actuated by malicious or improper motives.

12. In every case in which any costs are ordered to be paid by one party to another party, such costs, unless assessed as aforesaid, shall be taxed and certified by the Prothonotary; provided that the Court or a Judge or the Prothonotary shall have power to appoint such other officer as the Court or such Judge or the Prothonotary shall think fit to tax and certify the same.

13. All summonses, notices of motion, affidavits, and other documents (other than exhibits) used or intended to be used on any application to the Court or a Judge shall be intituled in the same manner as the notice of appeal.

14. The decrees and orders of the Court shall be signed by the Prothonotary and be under the appropriate office seal and forwarded to the Secretary.

15. The Court fees to be demanded and paid in respect of proceedings and matters under these rules shall be the same as those demanded from and paid by parties in similar matters in the Supreme Court.

16. Non-compliance with any of these rules shall not render any proceedings void unless the Court or a Judge so directs, but such proceedings may be set aside, either wholly or in part, as irregular, or amended or otherwise dealt with, in such manner and upon such terms (if any) as appear to be just.

MENTAL DEFECTIVES APPEAL RULES, 1940.

The nineteenth day of December, 1940.

Definitions.

1. In these rules, unless the context or subject-matter otherwise requires or indicates—

"The Act" means the Mental Defectives (Convicted Persons) Act, 1939.

"Magistrate" means the magistrate who conducted the inquiry pursuant to section 4 of the Act.

"Judge" means a judge of the Supreme Court.

"Appellant" means a prisoner appealing to a Judge pursuant to subsection (6) of section 4 of the Act against an order made by a Court of Quarter Sessions.

Forms.

2. The forms set out in the Schedule to these rules, with such alterations as circumstances require, shall be used in all cases where such forms are applicable; but any variance therefrom not being in matter of substance shall not affect the validity of the proceedings.

Notice of Appeal.

3. A prisoner desirous of appealing to a Judge pursuant to subsection (6) of section 4 of the Act against an order made by a Court of Quarter Sessions shall within 14 days from the date of such order or within such time as may be allowed for the institution of the appeal by a Judge on application made to him in that behalf, file a notice of appeal in the office of the Prothonotary. (Form No. 1.)

4. Within the same time he shall also serve a copy of the notice of appeal upon the Clerk of the Peace and the Crown Solicitor.

5. The notice of appeal shall be signed by the appellant or by some person on his behalf, and shall state the general grounds of his appeal

Documents.

6. Within 14 days of the receipt by him of the copy notice of appeal the Clerk of the Peace shall transmit to the Prothonotary all documents relating to the Appeal to Quarter Sessions, including a transcript of the evidence, the exhibits and the order made on such appeal. He shall also within the same time transmit to the Prothonotary the depositions taken on the hearing before the magistrate.

7. The appellant shall be entitled to copies of all documents transmitted by the Clerk of the Peace to the Prothonotary. On written application made to him the Clerk of the Peace shall supply the appellant with a copy of the proceedings before the Court of Quarter Sessions on payment of the usual fees therefor. If unable to pay such fees the appellant may apply in writing to the Prothonotary for a direction by a Judge that a copy of such proceedings be supplied to him free of cost.

Subpoena.

8. A subpoena may issue at the instance of either the Crown or the appellant for the attendance of any witness or for the production of any document upon the hearing of any such appeal, for the purpose of the production of evidence pursuant to leave granted by a Judge.

Fees.

9. No fees shall be charged for the filing of a notice of appeal or for issuing any process or for filing any document in connection with any appeal under these rules.

Abandonment of Appeal.

10. An appellant may abandon his appeal by forwarding to the Prothonotary a notice of abandonment (Form No. 2), whereupon the appeal shall be deemed to have been dismissed.

Hearing.

11. The Prothonotary shall enter the appeal for hearing before a Judge, and, as early as possible after receipt of the documents specified in Rule 6, shall give notice of the time and place of hearing to the appellant, the Crown Solicitor, and the Comptroller-General of Prisons (Form No. 3).

12. At the hearing of every such appeal the Crown shall bring before the Court the order appealed from, the depositions taken before the magistrate and a transcript of the evidence taken and the exhibits put in on the appeal to Quarter Sessions. Thereafter the Crown may by leave of the Judge call further evidence either in chief or in reply. The appellant may by leave of the Judge call further evidence on his own behalf. On the application of either the Crown or the appellant the Judge may direct that any witness examined on the appeal to Quarter Sessions shall attend to give further evidence or to be further cross-examined. The ordinary rules of procedure as to the examination and the cross-examination of witnesses shall be observed on the hearing of the appeal.

Result of Appeal.

13. The decision of the Judge hearing the appeal shall be endorsed on the notice of appeal by his Associate.

14. After determination of the appeal the Prothonotary shall notify the Clerk of the Peace of the result thereof, and shall also remit to him the documents transmitted in accordance with Rule 6. (Form No. 4.)

15. The Clerk of the Peace shall thereupon enter the particulars of such notification on his records.

Amendments, etc.

16. The Judge may make all such amendments as he may deem necessary and may proceed with the hearing of an appeal notwithstanding that the provisions of these rules have not been complied with or may adjourn the hearing of such appeal and give such directions as may be required.

MOTOR VEHICLES (THIRD PARTY INSURANCE) RULES.

The following rules shall be the rules regulating appeals to the Supreme Court under section 14 (8) of the Motor Vehicles (Third Party Insurance) Act, 1942.

(1) Where an application for approval of a person as an authorised insurer has been refused by the Minister or where the Minister has given notice of intention to cancel the approval of any person as an authorised insurer the applicant for such approval or the holder of an approval intended to be cancelled may enter an appeal by filing with the Prothonotary a notice of appeal (in or to the effect of the under-mentioned form) setting out the grounds and reasons of and for such appeal and serving a copy thereof upon the Commissioner for Road Transport.

(2) The appellant shall within fourteen days after the filing of the notice of appeal file and lodge in the Prothonotary's Office an appeal book comprising the notice of appeal, the refusal or notice of intention to cancel appealed from and any reasons given therefor and copies of any documents and evidence submitted to the Minister in connection with the application for approval as an authorised insurer or in the matter of an intended cancellation together with any affidavits filed as hereinafter mentioned by or on behalf of the Minister and by the appellant and shall within the like time also serve two copies of the appeal book on the Commissioner for Road Transport: Provided that where the appeal is referred to the Full Court the appellant shall lodge in the Court two extra copies of the appeal book.

(3) Within seven days after service of notice of appeal upon the Commissioner for Road Transport the Minister if he so desires may file or cause to be filed and served upon the appellant or his solicitor

an affidavit setting out any facts relevant to the subject matter of the appeal.

(4) Within three days of service of such affidavit the appellant may reply thereto by affidavit.

(5) The Supreme Court or a Judge thereof may at any time and upon such terms as may be deemed reasonable abridge or enlarge the times mentioned in Rules two, three and four hereof and may also allow further affidavits to be filed.

439. (Substituted 13 December, 1939)—All articles (including supplementary articles) of clerkship and assignments thereof shall be filed in the Court within one month from the date of execution thereof.

441. (1) (Substituted 29 July, 1942)—Every articulated clerk may, with the consent of the solicitor to whom he has been articulated and after serving such solicitor for a period of at least six months, without assignment serve with the Sydney agent of such solicitor any part of the remainder of the term of his articles not exceeding one year.

444. (Substituted 13 December, 1944, as from 1 October, 1945)—Every first law examination shall be conducted by such person as may from time to time be appointed by the Judges, and shall consist of two papers, paper A of three hours and paper B of one and one half hours.

Paper A shall be a general paper on the main divisions of the law and the meaning of some of the more important legal concepts, the sources of law in New South Wales, the history of the courts in England and New South Wales, the organisation of the superior courts in England and New South Wales, the general principles of constitutional law, the Commonwealth constitution, and the Judiciary Act. Candidates will not be expected to know the decisions on these enactments.

Paper B shall be on legal ethics and solicitors' trust accounts.

445. (Substituted 13 December, 1944, as from 1 October, 1945)—The intermediate examination in law shall consist of one paper of three hours, set in two parts, on the following matters:—

Part I.—Nature and formation of contracts, including capacity of parties and mistake.

Part II.—A general knowledge of the land law, with particular reference to those portions of the history of the same relevant to the understanding of the present law.

446. (Substituted 13 December, 1944, as from 1 October, 1945)—The subjects and papers of the final examination in law shall be as follow:—

Section 1.—Paper A. 3 hours. Real and personal property.

Paper B. 2 hours. Those portions of contracts, including quasi-contracts, not prescribed for the intermediate examination. Questions may however, be asked on or involving a knowledge of those portions of contracts prescribed for the intermediate examination.

Section 2.—Paper A. 3 hours. Equity, including trusts, but excluding such portions of equity as fall within Paper B.

Paper B. 2 hours. Wills, executors and administrators, probate law and practice, administration of estates.

(NOTE: Questions on practice may be asked in either paper, so far as relevant to the subject-matter prescribed for that paper.)

Section 3.—One paper. 3 hours. Conveyancing and legal interpretation.

Section 4.—Paper A. 3 hours. Mercantile law and bankruptcy.

Paper B. 3 hours. Company law and partnership.

Section 5.—Paper A. 3 hours. Torts.

Paper B. 2 hours. Criminal law and practice.

Section 6.—Paper A. 2 hours. Divorce and domestic relations and divorce practice.

Paper B. 3 hours. Procedure and evidence.

448. (Added 13 December, 1939)—Provided also that examinations may be held at the New England University College at Armidale in such terms as the Board may deem convenient.

448. (Added 4 August, 1943)—Provided further that where any candidate satisfies the Board that he is precluded by reason of war service or duties in connection with the war from attending for examination at Sydney or such other place or places as may be appointed by the Board under the preceding provisos the Board may, if it sees fit so to do, examine that candidate at such place whether within or without the State of New South Wales and at such time as may be convenient.

448A. (Rescinded 27 November, 1946.)

450. (Substituted 13 December, 1944, as from 1 October, 1945)—Every articulated clerk who is a graduate at the time of entering into articles shall pass the first law examination, the intermediate law examination, and the final law examination, and may present himself for examination as follows:—

First and intermediate law examinations.—6 months after date of articles.

Section 1.—6 months after first presenting himself for examination in the first and intermediate law examinations.

Sections 2 and 3.—6 months after first presenting himself for examination in Section 1.

Sections 4 and 5.—6 months after first presenting himself for examination in Sections 2 and 3.

Section 6.—6 months after first presenting himself for examination in Sections 4 and 5.

451. (Substituted 13 December, 1944, as from 1 October, 1945)—Every clerk who is entitled to present himself for examination under these rules and who has attended lectures and passed examinations prescribed for students in the Faculty of Law in the University of Sydney shall be exempt from examinations as provided in this rule.

If after attending the prescribed lectures he has obtained upon examination the degree of Bachelor of Laws he shall be exempt from paper A of the first law examination, the intermediate law examination and the final law examination. A clerk who is attending lectures as a candidate for the Bachelor of Laws degree may present himself for examination in paper B of the first law examination at any examination held not less than six months after the date of his articles.

If after attending the prescribed lectures he has passed in the annual examination in any subject or subjects corresponding to paper A of the first law examination or to the intermediate law examination or to any section of the final law examination he shall be exempt from the corresponding examination or section prescribed by these rules.

Except in regard to any examination from which he is exempt under this rule he shall give all notices and pay all fees required in the case of an articulated clerk proceeding to an examination prescribed by these rules.

The Board may give such directions as it may deem proper with respect to the time at which a clerk who is entitled to any exemption may present himself for any subsequent examination prescribed by these rules.

Any exemption under this rule shall apply with respect to an examination passed before or after its commencement.

451A. (Substituted 31 May, 1943)—Where in connection with any war to which Great Britain is a party any British subject in the service of Great Britain her dominions or dependencies or her allies has been engaged abroad on active service or on duties connected with the war, or any British subject has been a prisoner of war or a civilian internee in an enemy country, and such person produces a certificate from the Council of Legal Education, or other body in Great Britain approved by the Judges, or any three of them, that he has passed any of the examinations required or accepted by such Council or body from persons seeking admission as a Solicitor or Law Agent of the Superior Courts of Great Britain, or produces a certificate from the University of London or other University approved by the Judges, or any three of them, that he has passed an examination in law conducted by that University such as would be accepted by that University for the purpose of its degree in law if such person were a candidate for such degree, and satisfies the Board that he passed such examination before his return from abroad, the Board may exempt such person from examination in any subject if, in its opinion, he has in manner aforesaid passed a substantially equivalent examination.

451B. (Rescinded 13 December, 1939.)

452. (1) Any articled clerk who satisfies the Board that he has been or may be prevented by defence service from presenting himself for any examination in law under these rules at the time appointed thereunder, or that he intends on passing any such examination to enlist for active service, may, with the leave of the Board, present himself for a special examination at such time or for a subsequent examination after such interval as the Board may appoint or determine.

(2) The Board may require any applicant for any special examination to pay an additional fee not exceeding £5.

(3) The special first law examination shall be conducted by the President and the first law examiner. Any other special examination shall be conducted by the President and such other member or members of the Board as the Board may appoint for the purpose. The result of any special examination shall be reported to the Board at its next meeting.

455B. (Substituted 11 November, 1943)—Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these rules, any articled clerk who satisfies the Board that he has theretofore been, then is, or will thereafter be engaged in defence service may present himself for any of the examinations under

these rules at such times, and may take the intermediate examination and the sections of the final examination in such order, as the Board, if it thinks fit to vary in the case of such articulated clerk the times or order prescribed by these rules, may appoint or determine.

456A. (Added 13 December, 1944, as from 1 October, 1945)—(1) Any articulated clerk who prior to October, 1945, shall have passed or been deemed to have passed all the examinations required of him under the rules immediately prior thereto in force shall not be required to pass any further examinations under these present rules. (2) Subject to (3) hereof, all other articulated clerks shall be required to pass under these present rules examinations or further examinations indicated in the following table :—

An articulated clerk coming under (v) may present himself for examination in section 6 six months after first presenting himself for section 4.

An articulated clerk coming under (vi) may present himself for examination in paper B of section 2 three months after first presenting himself for section 3 under the rules previously in force, for section 3 (under the present rules) six months after first presenting himself for paper B of section 2, and for paper A of section 4 three months after first presenting himself for section 3.

An articulated clerk coming under (vii) may present himself for examination in section 3 six months after first presenting himself for examination in section 4 under the rules previously in force, and for paper B of section 6 six months after first presenting himself for section 3.

An articulated clerk coming under (viii) may present himself for paper B of section 6 six months after first presenting himself for the examination last passed by him under the rules previously in force.

(3) In any case considered by the Board to possess special features taking it out of the provisions of (1) and (2) the Board may give special directions as to what examinations or further examinations shall be taken by the articulated clerk concerned and as to the time or times and the order of such examinations.

457. (Substituted 13 December, 1939).—Where these rules provide that an articled clerk may present himself for examination after the lapse of a specified time from first presenting himself for some other examination the provision shall be subject to his having passed such other examination.

(Proviso added 12 November, 1942).—

Provided that while Rule 448A remains in force the Board may in relation to any particular examination exempt from the operation of this Rule any articled clerk whose answers in such other examination are, in the opinion of the Board, sufficiently meritorious to warrant such exemption.

458. (2) (f) (Subclause added 19 December, 1947).—

(f) In the case of applications under Rule 428 (o) such certificates or documents as are required by this Rule to be supplied in respect of the particular service or practice specified, with such modifications as are necessary in view of the shorter periods of service or practice involved.

459. (New paragraph added 13 December, 1939.)

The Judges may give such permission and upon such conditions, if any, as they think fit, if they are satisfied that there is sufficient reason for so doing, whether on the ground of defence service or otherwise.

460A. (Added 13 December, 1944.) Where any person states to the Board that upon grounds specified by him he is qualified (apart from his being engaged upon defence service) to be articled, and satisfies the Board that he is engaged upon defence service, the Board may admit him to its examinations as though he were articled, and if he should subsequently be articled he shall be entitled to count any examinations which he may have passed in virtue of this rule as if they had been regularly passed during the term of his articles.

462. (Substituted 18 February, 1942). Every articled clerk desirous of proceeding to any examination under these Rules shall give notice to the Secretary fourteen days at least before the commencement of the term in which such examination is to be held; provided that the Secretary, if satisfied that an articled clerk has good reason for being late, may accept any such notice within three days of the last day prescribed for giving such notice upon payment to the Secretary of an additional fee of ten shillings; and provided further that the Secretary, if satisfied that failure to give notice in time was occasioned by defence service and that notwithstanding the lateness of notice it is practicable to admit the articled clerk to examination, may accept any such notice without such additional fee at any time prior to the examination.

477. (Added 19 November, 1941, at end thereof)—“Every such person shall also lodge with the Secretary a statutory declaration that he is a British subject, annexing thereto a certified copy of his birth certificate or certificate of naturalization, or other evidence of his British nationality.”

478. (Substituted 11 August, 1941.) Every such person shall also cause notice of his intended application to be three several times during such term published in one Sydney daily newspaper.

479. (Paragraph (a) amended 8 March, 1944, by substituting for the words “two respectable householders” the words “two prescribed persons.”

480A. (21 March, 1940). (1) Where the applicant has been prevented by defence service from serving the full term of his articles without a break, the Board may regard defence service for a period not exceeding four months in each year of the articles as service under articles.

(2) Where a break in service under articles occurs through the death of a master solicitor or through any other cause which the Board deems sufficient, the Board may regard service under articles as being continuous notwithstanding such break, provided that it does not exceed twenty-eight days.

491. (Substituted 13 December, 1939.) In the case of any articulated clerk the Court may, if satisfied there is sufficient reason for so doing, whether on the ground of defence service or otherwise, relax or dispense with any of these rules, and may make such order as in the opinion of the Court the circumstances require.

492A. (Rescinded 13 December, 1939, and following rule promulgated 18 February, 1944)—In the case of any person engaged or who has been engaged on active defence service in time of war the Court may in its absolute discretion and upon such conditions as it thinks fit relax any of the Rules relating to the admission of solicitors under the subclauses (f) (3) and (g) of Rule 428.

SOLICITOR SOLDIERS' DELEGATION RULES.

The thirteenth day of March, 1941.

The following rules, which may be cited as the "Solicitor Soldiers' Delegation Rules," are made pursuant to section 4 (1) (f) of the Legal Practitioners (War Service) Amendment Act, 1940:—

(1) In these rules, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires or indicates:—

"The Act" means the Legal Practitioners (War Service) Amendment Act, 1940.

"Instrument" means an instrument of delegation, revocation of delegation, or resignation of office as delegate under section 4 of the Act.

(2) The Prothonotary shall cause every instrument or verified copy thereof filed in his office under the provisions of the Act to be numbered and shall keep a book in his office in which he shall cause to be entered the name of the solicitor soldier, the name of the delegate, the date of the instrument, the nature of the instrument, the date of filing, the date of determination, and any other particulars that to the Prothonotary shall seem necessary or desirable.

(3) Where it is proposed to file a copy of an instrument it shall be verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of the delegate except in the case of a revocation of delegation when it shall be similarly verified by the solicitor soldier.

(4) Where the instrument of delegation has not been executed by the delegate, his consent in writing to act in accordance therewith shall be endorsed thereon, or other satisfactory evidence of such consent furnished to the Prothonotary.

(5) Before registering a delegation the Prothonotary shall satisfy himself that the person making the delegation is a solicitor soldier within the meaning of the Act. For this purpose the person making the delegation by a clause in the delegation or by statutory declaration thereto annexed shall state precisely the obligations as to service which he claims bring him within the definition in the Act. In the case of delegations made before the date of these rules the delegate shall obtain from a service officer of senior rank a certificate setting forth facts establishing that the person making the delegation was a solicitor soldier and shall file the same or a copy thereof verified by affidavit or statutory declaration.

(6) Where a delegate carries on the solicitor soldier's practice away from what was at the time of the delegation the solicitor soldier's office, the delegate shall display on his own office the name of the solicitor soldier with at least equal prominence to that given to the name of the delegate.

(7) Where a delegate carries on the solicitor soldier's practice in an office which was at the time of the delegation the office of the solicitor soldier, the delegate shall maintain the name of the solicitor soldier in the same form in which it appeared at the time of the delegation and shall not add his own name unless expressly authorised by the instrument of delegation.

TESTATOR'S FAMILY MAINTENANCE AND GUARDIANSHIP OF INFANTS ACT RULES.

Tuesday, the tenth day of December, 1946.

IN pursuance of the several powers vested in us in that behalf, we do order and direct in the manner following:—

(1) Any application under Section 3 of the Testator's Family Maintenance and Guardianship of Infants Act, 1916-1938, shall be made by originating summons.

(2) An originating summons under this Act shall be in the form or to the effect of the form in the Schedule to these Rules, altered to meet the circumstances of the case.

(3) The persons to be served with the said summons shall be the executors of the will or the administrator of the estate as the case may be and such persons as the Court may direct to be served in addition to or in lieu thereof.

(4) Rules 9 and 10 of the Rules in the Fourth Schedule to the Equity Act, 1901, shall apply to the said summons.

(5) The executor or administrator as the case may be, when entering an appearance, shall file and serve an affidavit setting out the nature and amount of the estate and giving such information as is available to the deponent as to the family of the testator or intestate and the persons entitled beneficially in the said estate.

(6) The applicant shall file all affidavits in support of the said summons within the time limited for appearance, and upon the appearance of any respondent shall serve copies of the said affidavits upon him.

(7) A respondent shall file and serve all affidavits to be used by him in opposition to the said summons within twenty-one days of the expiration of the time limited for appearance.

(8) Upon the expiration of the time limited for appearance, if no respondent has appeared and upon the expiration of the said twenty-one days, if a respondent has appeared, the applicant shall set the summons down for hearing and shall give the respondents who have appeared or have been authorised to appear seven days' notice of the date of hearing.

If the applicant does not set the summons down for hearing within seven days of the expiration of the said twenty-one days any respondent who has appeared may set the summons down for hearing and shall give seven days' notice of the date of such hearing to the applicant and to such other respondents as have appeared.

[Cf. Preliminary Rule VII of the Consolidated Equity Rules and see Equity Act, 1901, S. 22 (2) and S. 94 (2).]

(9) These Rules shall come into operation on the first day of March, 1947, and shall apply on and after that date.

- (c) Stating the conditions, restrictions or limitations imposed by the Court; and
- (d) Stating the manner in which the costs of and incidental to this application should be paid.

Or if the applicant is a widow and her husband died intestate reference should be made to maintenance only and notice should be served on such persons as the Court may direct.—See Section 3 (1A).]

THIRD PARTY RULES

(under Law Reform (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1946).

Tuesday, the second day of November, 1948.

Pursuant to the powers vested in us by the Law Reform (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1946, we do order and direct that—

1. A defendant claiming relief against any person under section 3 (1) of the Law Reform (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1946 (which person is hereinafter called the third party), shall, after the service upon him of the declaration in any action brought against him, file and serve notice of his claim on the third party in the form prescribed by these rules, with such variations as circumstances may require.

2. The defendant shall, with the prescribed notice, serve a copy of the writ of summons and declaration and any pleading or other document served on him by the plaintiff.

3. The time within which the notice of claim and other documents shall be served upon a third party after service of the declaration upon the defendant shall, according to the residence of the third party, be the time prescribed by Rule 34 of the General Rules of Court for the appearance of a defendant after service of a writ of summons.

4. The defendant shall within eight days of service upon him of the declaration file and serve upon the plaintiff and all parties to the action a copy of the notice of claim intended to be served on the third party, and thereupon all further proceedings in the action shall be stayed until an appearance is entered by the third party or if not entered then until the expiration of the time fixed by these rules for the appearance of such third party.

5. The prescribed notice shall be served in the same manner as provided by law for the service of a writ of summons.

6. The defendant, immediately upon service of the notice of claim upon the third party, shall inform the plaintiff and all other parties to the action in writing that service of the notice of claim has been effected and the date upon which the same was made.

7. The time for appearance by a third party after service of the prescribed notice shall be as provided by Rule 34 of the General Rules of Court for the appearance of a defendant after service of a writ of summons.

8. The third party upon entering an appearance shall forthwith serve the plaintiff and all other parties to the action with notice thereof.

9. (a) After such appearance has been entered and within the time hereinafter prescribed for so doing the defendant shall file and serve upon the third party a formal statement of all essential allegations of his claim against the third party in the like manner and form of the declaration of a plaintiff's case, which will be known as "the defendant's declaration of third party claim."

(b) The defendant shall at the same time serve a copy of such declaration upon the plaintiff and all other parties to the action.

10. After service upon the third party of such declaration of third party claim the third party may take any step with respect thereto as if the same was a declaration served upon the third party by a plaintiff including any plea, application or objection thereto as may be taken by any defendant in accordance with the practice of the court. Thereafter the pleadings in such action shall, as between the defendant and such third party, continue as in the case of any action at law until issue has been joined. On and after the service of the defendant's declaration of third party claim as hereinbefore prescribed the pleadings shall continue as between the plaintiff and other parties to the action in accordance with the usual practice and procedure prescribed in that behalf until issue has been joined. Upon issue joined between all hereinbefore mentioned parties the plaintiff shall file and serve the several issues so joined in accordance with the usual practice and procedure in an action at law. Thereupon the action shall proceed in like manner as if the third party had been joined as a defendant by the plaintiff as provided by section 2 of the Act and the record shall be amended accordingly.

11. The court or a judge, either at the hearing or upon application in chambers, may make all such orders and give all such directions as may be necessary or expedient for the proper trial of the action and generally in relation to any question arising in the cause or matter or with respect to

the parties thereto, including any order as to costs, and any enlargement of time may be ordered, although the application for the same is not made until after the expiration of the time allowed.

TAKE NOTICE that this action has been brought by the plaintiff against the defendant. In it the plaintiff claims against the defendant the sum of _____ for damages for negligence as appears by the endorsement on the writ of summons and by the declaration, copies whereof are delivered herewith.

The defendant claims to be entitled to contribution or complete indemnity from you in respect of any sum which the plaintiff may recover herein against him to the extent of such amount as may be found by the court to be just and equitable having regard to your responsibility for such damages on the ground that your breaches of duty contributed to the plaintiff's injury.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that if you wish to dispute the plaintiff's claim against the defendant or the defendant's claim against you, you must cause an appearance to be entered for you within _____ days after the service of this notice upon you. In default of you entering such appearance you will be deemed to admit the plaintiff's claim against the defendant and the defendant's claim against you and your liability to indemnify the defendant or contribute to the extent claimed hereinbefore and the validity of any judgment that may be given in the case and you will be bound by such judgment and such judgment may be enforced against you pursuant to the Law Reform (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1946.

1. The English text-books prescribed for this Examination are, in great measure, prescribed for the purpose of indicating the scope and subject matter of the examination; but, on all subjects where the law in force in New South Wales differs from the English law, candidates are required to make themselves acquainted with the law in force in New South Wales. Text-books or parts of text-books which require to be read in connection with the local statutes are marked with an asterisk.

2. Candidates are reminded that English Statutes passed after the 25th July, 1828, are not in force in this State, except in cases where the enactment has been made binding by the Imperial Parliament, either expressly or by necessary implication. At the same time, a considerable number of English Statutes passed after that date (such as the English Wills Act, 1837), have been expressly adopted by the local Legislature; whilst a considerable number of other local enactments are based on similar enactments passed in the United Kingdom. As to how far law in force in England prior to the 25th July, 1828, applies in New South Wales, reference may be made to Webb's "Imperial Law." As to how far English Statutes have been adopted by, or embodied in, local legislation, reference may be made to Curlewis's "Table of Statutes."

3. In cases where local Statutes are expressly prescribed as subjects for examination, the examination will be confined, so far as possible, to the general tenor and essential, or more important, provisions of the Statutes referred to: or, in other words, to such matters as would find a place in a student's text-book. The English text-book will serve, to some extent, as a guide in this matter. Candidates may also obtain a few copies of previous papers, for the purpose of guidance, on applying to the Secretary to the Board.

4. Notice to Candidates for the Intermediate and Final Examinations in Law.

1. The English text-books prescribed for these examinations are in a great measure, prescribed for the purpose of indicating the scope and subject matter of the examination: but, on all subjects where the law in force in New South Wales differs from the English Law, candidates are required to make themselves acquainted with the law in force in New South Wales. Text-books or parts of books which require to be read in connection with local statutes, are marked with an asterisk.

2. Candidates are reminded that English statutes, passed after the 25th July, 1828, are not in force in this State, except in cases where the enactment has been made binding by the Imperial Parliament, either expressly or by necessary implication. At the same time, a considerable number of English statutes passed after that date (such as the English Wills Act, 1837), have been expressly adopted by the local legislature; whilst a considerable number of local enactments have been based on similar enactments previously passed in the United Kingdom. As to how far law in force in England prior to 25th July, 1828, applies in New South Wales, reference may be made to Webb's "Imperial Law." As to how far English statutes have been adopted by, or embodied in, local legislation, reference may be made to Curlewis' "Tables of Statutes."

3. In cases where local statutes are expressly prescribed as subjects for examination, the examination will be confined, so far as possible, to the general tenor and essential or more important provisions of the statutes referred to; or, in other words, to such matters as would find a place in a student's text-book. The English text-books will serve, to some extent, as a guide in this matter.

4. Candidates are reminded that the State laws on some of the subjects included in these examinations are liable to be superseded by Federal legislation; whilst on other subjects the existing Acts may be displaced by Consolidated Acts. Candidates are further reminded that they are liable to be examined in any Acts or Rules relating to the subjects of these examinations passed or made by either the State or the Federal Parliament more than six calendar months prior to the date at which such examinations may be held.

5. Candidates are also advised, prior to entering on their studies for the final examination, to make themselves acquainted with the general tenor of both the Interpretation Act, 1897 (New South Wales), and the Acts Interpretation Act, 1901 (Commonwealth); whilst they are also reminded that the interpretation of Imperial statutes, applicable in either State or Commonwealth, is governed by the Interpretation Act, 1889 (Imperial).

6. Where chapters, sections, or pages are referred to, the reference is to be deemed "inclusive," unless otherwise expressed.

LAW INSTITUTE'S PRIZES FOR ARTICLED CLERKS.

The Council of the Incorporated Law Institute of New South Wales has announced that for the encouragement of legal studies amongst articulated clerks taking the examinations conducted by the Solicitors Admission Board, two prizes will be offered annually by the Institute. One prize is to be called “The Law Institute Intermediate Examination Prize” and will be of the value of £10, and the other is to be called “The Law Institute Final Examination Prize” and will be of the value of £40. The rules governing the award of the prizes are as follow, and therein “the Institute” means “the Incorporated Law Institute of New South Wales” and “the Board” means “The Solicitors Admission Board”:

1. The “Law Institute Intermediate Examination Prize” shall be awarded to that articulated clerk who shall be reported by the Board to the Council of the Institute as having (amongst articulated clerks) displayed the most merit at any intermediate examination in law conducted by the Board in the year in which the prize is to be awarded.

Provided that if in any year the Board reports to the Council of the Institute that no articled clerk has passed the examination sufficiently meritoriously to be worthy of the prize, no prize shall be awarded in that year.

2. The "Law Institute Final Examination Prize" shall be awarded to that articled clerk who, having completed the Final examination in law in the year in respect of which the prize is to be awarded, is reported by the Board to the Council of the Institute to have displayed (amongst articled clerks) the most merit over the whole of his or her final examination in law.

Provided that if in any year the Board reports to the Council that no articled clerk completing the final examination in that year has displayed sufficient merit to be worthy of the prize, no prize shall be awarded in that year.

3. If the Board so recommends, the Council of the Institute may divide either prize between two or more candidates.

4. Only those articled clerks shall be eligible for the award of the Law Institute Intermediate Examination Prize who have passed the intermediate examination in law at an examination conducted by the Board, and only those shall be eligible for the Law Institute Final Examination Prize who have passed the whole of the final examination in law at examinations conducted by the Board.

Provided, however, that an articled clerk who has passed an examination or examinations under rule 451A shall not on that account be deemed ineligible for an award.

5. For the purposes of these rules "articled clerk" means a person who is articled to a practising solicitor, and includes a person whose articles have expired and a person whose service under articles has been broken by the death of his master solicitor or other cause which the Board deems sufficient and who satisfies the Board that he intends to enter into supplementary articles as soon as reasonably possible.

LAW SCHOOL COMFORTS FUND MEMORIAL PRIZES FOR EX-SERVICEMEN TAKING THE BARRISTERS' ADMISSION BOARD'S COURSE.

The Committee of the Law School Comforts Fund has donated to the Barristers' Admission Board the sum of £50 to provide an annual prize of £10 for five years for a returned serviceman student on completion of the Board's course.

The award of the prizes will be made in accordance with the following rules:—

(1) For the purposes of these rules:

"Student" means a student-at-law who has returned to civilian life after service in the naval, military or air forces of the Crown.

"Board" means the Barristers' Admission Board.

(2) To be eligible for a prize a student shall have completed the whole of the Board's course of examinations, or, in the case of students who are not required to pass in certain subjects of the Board's course by reason of their having passed in such subjects in the annual examinations in the Faculty of Arts or of Law in the University of Sydney, a substantial part thereof.

(3) The prize shall be awarded after the completion of the fourth term examinations in any year to such student who, in the opinion of the Board, shall, among the students who have completed their examinations in that year, have displayed the most merit over the whole of his or her examinations; provided, however, that if in any year the Board is of opinion that no student has displayed sufficient merit to be worthy of the prize, or in the event that no student has completed the examinations in that year, no prize shall be awarded that year.

(4) If, in the opinion of the Board, two or more students have displayed equal merit in respect of their examinations, the Board shall have the right either to divide the prize or to award it to the student whom it regards as having had the most meritorious war service.

(5) To the fifth annual prize there shall be added any interest which may have accrued from any investment of the prize moneys which may have been made by the Board.

LAW SCHOOL COMFORTS FUND MEMORIAL PRIZES FOR EX-SERVICEMEN TAKING THE SOLICITORS' ADMISSION BOARD'S COURSE.

In 1946 the Committee of the Law School Comforts Fund gave to the Solicitors' Admission Board the sum of £50 to provide an annual prize of £10 for five years for a returned serviceman.

The prizes will be awarded in accordance with the following rules :—

(1) To be eligible for a prize a candidate shall have (a) returned to civilian life after a period of full time service in the naval, military or air forces of the Crown during the War, 1939-1945; and (b) completed the whole of the Board's course of examinations, or, in the case of candidates who are not required to pass in certain subjects of the Board's course by reason of their having passed equivalent examinations in the University of Sydney, a substantial part thereof deemed by the Board to be sufficient.

(2) The prize shall be awarded after the completion of the fourth term examinations in any year to the candidate who, in the opinion of the Board, shall, among the candidates who have completed the course in that year, have shewn the most merit in the subjects of the Final Law Examination.

(3) If, in the opinion of the Board, two or more candidates have shewn equal merit in examinations, the Board may either divide the prize or award it to the candidate it considers most deserving having regard to the duration and nature of the candidate's war service.

(4) The Board's decision shall be final both as to whether any particular candidate is eligible for a prize and as to the respective merits and deserts of those eligible.

(5) To the fifth annual prize there shall be added any interest which may have accrued from any investment of the prize moneys which may have been made by the Board.
